O. W. Richards, representing the Business Mens. Assn. of the Mt. Union M.E. Church, addressed council on the subject of a better water supply for Mt. Union.

The committee on water submitted the following report.

To the Honorable Council of the City of Alliance O
Gentlemen:

We, the joint committee to whom was referred the question of improving the water supply, beg leave to report as follows.

We recommend that a new dam be constructed below the present one; that the river be dredged and a new intake provided at an approximate cost of \$20,000.00

that new pipe lines be arranged for dividing the system between the residence and business consumers at an approximate cost of \$15,000.00; that a booster station be provided to give better water facilities at Mount Union at an approximate cost of \$7500.00; that the search for wells be continued, and that a sum be set aside for this purpose and for well equipment to the amount of \$5500.00, which gives a grand total of \$48,000.00 which is within the amount for which we can issue bonds at the present time for this purpose.

We are favorable to settling and storage basins and ask that more careful estimates be prepared so that these questions can be put to the people for authority to issue bonds for this purpose.

Gentlemen:

The committee to whom was referred the question as to whether or not the city should contribute to the erection of additional Hospital buildings, beg to report as follows

That in a general way we are favorable to the proposition, providing a contract can be entered into between the present Hospital Organization and the City, whereby the City's interests will be safe-guarded. It has occurred to us that the Hospital should be in the control of a Board, each party to the contract being represented in proportion to the investment, one representative for \$50,000 of any investment.

We find it rather difficult to stipulate any amount that we would recommend in the absence of any definite plans.

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but believe that a sum of \$35,000.00 invested in buildings in addition to property already owned, would furnish Hospital requirements for a number of years to come.

It is our idea that plans should be drawn up and submitted to the Council for approval.

We your Sewer Committee which the matter
of the River Street sewer was referred to, we
beg to report that in our judgement the construction
of this sewer as the original resolution covers it,
will put a great hardship on W. H. Rickard
who owns the abutting property to an extent
of about eight hundred and fifty feet; therefore,
we recommend that this sewer be shortened by
at least three hundred and fifty feet at the
east end or to stop fifty feet west of
W. H. Rickard's Grocery Store. If this cannot
be done with the first resolution, we ask that
there be a new resolution drawn and the
sewer stopped fifty feet west from W. H.
Rickard's Grocery Store on River Street.
