Alliance O., July 10<sup>th</sup>, 1911

To the Honorable Council

of Alliance O.

Impinger -

In as much as it is not practical to  
sewer certain property lying both within  
the corporate limits of Alliance and certain  
property lying without the corporate limits of  
Alliance without building a new sewer main,  
it is proposed by persons either owning or  
acting for others mentioned hereafter, to  
construct in private right-of-way a new  
sewer line west of the Rockhill Road,  
running through a low point of land,  
making an available trunk line for  
a large addition of territory to the city.

Therefore, we the undersigned petition  
your Honorable Body for the privilege of  
connecting this trunk line sewer into  
some part of the municipal system  
that may be most convenient to use.

The city to be put to no expense  
whatever either in the building or the  
connecting of any portion of the same  
it being understood that this main  
will give service to lands lying within  
the corporate limits contributing to the  
expense of its construction. It is desired  
to begin this work at an early date  
and put it through to completion and  
we therefore ask your Honorable Body to  
take such action in the matter as it  
may be necessary at your very earliest  
convenience

Giger moved, seconded by Kellogg that action be deferred on the communication and that parties be requested to furnish plans of the proposed sewers.

The following were

Mr. Patton submitted a communication which was read relating to the water supply. (which was filed)

Giger moved, seconded by Troy that action be ~~taken~~ deferred, and the communication referred to the Director of Public Service.

Attorney H. C. Kochler appeared before council and urged early action with regard to granting a right of way to the Cleveland, Alliance and Mahoning Valley Railroad company to enter Alliance.

He stated that the company was being backed by the people of Alliance and that property owners along North Union Avenue had signed petitions, which he presented, asking council to grant a franchise.

Relative to the cost he said that the expense should be borne equally by the city and the company.

Mr. Kochler presented the following communication:

To the Honorable Members of the Alliance City Council  
Gentlemen

We herewith submit a draft of an ordinance for the Cleveland, Alliance, Mahoning Valley Railroad Company, which will explain itself, with the request that your honorable body take immediate action to pass the necessary resolutions and ordinances to give to the Railroad Company the franchise rights embodied in the ordinance herewith submitted.

We also ask your honorable body to take such steps by resolution and ordinance or otherwise as may be necessary to change the grade and construction of North Union Avenue from near Ely Street South under the overhead bridge of the Pittsburgh, Ft. Wayne & Chicago Railroad Company to Main Street, to make a reasonable grade so as to permit the interurban and city cars of said Railroad Company to pass on that street.

In connection with the last request, we ask that the City Council and the Railroad Company bear the expense of the changes so to be made, including damage to abutting property, if any, in the ratio that the part of the street to be occupied by the Railroad Company shall bear to the remainder of the improved portion of the street.
