To the Honorable Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio
The undersigned hereby request permission to construct maintain and operate a street and interurban ^{railway} in the city of Alliance, State of Ohio, over, along and upon the following street in said City.

Beginning at the North line of Vine Street immediately west of and adjoining to the west right-of-way line of the Cleveland & Muskegon Railroad Company; thence in a southeasterly direction along the west side

side of said Cleveland - Pittsburg Railroad Company's right of way across Vine Street to North Union Avenue; thence South on North Union Avenue to the intersection of Main Street and said North Union Avenue; thence East along Main Street to the west boundary line of the Cleveland - Pittsburg Railroad Company's right of way on said Main Street

Said railroad to consist of a single track, with the necessary switches, turnouts, curves, loops, Ys, poles, wires and all other necessary fixtures and apparatus, and to be operated by electricity or other motive power except steam.
