

Ordinance No. 26-C.

Mr. H. F. Miller:

An ordinance prohibiting the unlawful manufacture, sale, transportation, furnishing or possessing of intoxicating liquors in the City of Alliance and providing the punishment therefor.

Be It Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance, State Of Ohio.

Section 1. — Whoever unlawfully manufactures, sells, transports, furnishes or possesses intoxicating liquors in the City of Alliance, shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and for a second or subsequent offense shall be fined not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or be imprisoned not more than sixty (60) days or both.

Section 2. — All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. — This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and its immediate passage necessary for the preservation of the public safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Mr. Ryan:

An ordinance requiring property owners to secure a permit for the construction of sidewalks.

Be It Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance, State Of Ohio:

Section - 1. That no person or persons shall construct a sidewalk in the city of Alliance, Ohio until they have secured a permit from the City engineer to construct said walks.

Section - 2. That all sidewalks must be laid to the line and grade established by the City Engineer and no line or grade will be established until the person or persons desiring to construct said walks shall have placed the necessary material for the construction of said walks on the ground.

Section - 3. That upon the completion of the construction of said sidewalks the property owner shall notify the City Engineer who shall inspect same and if said walks are constructed according to the standard of construction of sidewalks in the City of Alliance, Ohio and provided further that all the provisions of this ordinance have been complied with the City Engineer shall issue a certificate of inspection approving said walks.

Section - 4. That no certificate of inspection shall be issued by the City Engineer unless the property owner has complied with the provisions of all ordinances of the City of Alliance, Ohio in reference to the construction of sidewalks.

Section - 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Mr. Ryan:

An Ordinance restricting the parking of certain vehicles on Linden Avenue, between Market Street and Prospect Street.

Be It Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance State Of Ohio:

Section - 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation to park or cause to be parked any dray, bus, truck or other vehicle used for the purpose of draying or as a carrier of goods on Linden Avenue between Market Street and Prospect Street in the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Section - 2. That any person or persons, firm or corporation found guilty of the violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00

Section - 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Mr. Weaver:

An Ordinance to provide for the removal of screens, blinds and other devices placed on doors and windows for the purpose of obstructing the view of the interior of public places of business in the city of Alliance, Ohio.

Be It Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance, State Of Ohio:

Section - 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation to obstruct, maintain, or permit a screen, blind, stained glass window or other device of any kind whatsoever to be placed over or in front of a door or window in business places in the City of Alliance, Ohio in such a manner so as to obstruct the view of the interior thereof.

Section - 2. That any person or persons, firm or corporation found guilty of the violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00

Section - 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and that its immediate enactment is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare.

Section - 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Ordinance Number 8-D. 8-C

Mr. J. H. Miller :

An ordinance to license keepers of place of business commonly known as soft drink parlors within the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Be it Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Section - 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation to open or keep a public place, commonly known as a soft drink parlor without first obtaining a license from the Mayor as hereinafter provided.

Section - 2. That the Mayor may issue a license to persons for opening and keeping a public place commonly known as a soft drink parlor, that such license shall be for a period of one year, for which the Mayor shall charge and collect a fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each license so issued. That such license may be renewed at the expiration thereof and for a like period of time upon a payment of a like fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). That such license shall also state the location at which such place may be opened, the name of the owner and keeper of the place and that no other place shall be kept than that stated in the license. That said license shall not be assigned or transferred. Be it further provided that said license may be revoked by the Mayor at any time after the licensee shall be convicted of any offense under the Laws of the State of Ohio or the ordinances of the City of Alliance, Ohio without refunding said licensee any portion of the fee so paid.

Section - 3. That no license shall be issued to any person or persons who are not citizens of the United States.

Section - 4. Any person or persons found guilty of violating any provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than one Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), and for each subsequent offense shall be fined not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

Section - 5. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure

and that its immediate enactment is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare.

Section - 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1-B

Mr. Weaver: To issue bonds for the purpose of paying the city's portion of constructing sanitary sewer Nos. 113-A, 176, 177, 156.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO, TWO-THIRDS OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1. That it is deemed necessary by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, to issue and sell the bonds of said City in the sum of \$2528.00 for the purpose of paying the city's portion of the cost and expense of constructing sanitary sewers Nos. 113-A, 176, 177, 156.

Section 2. That the bonds of said City be issued in the sum of \$2528.00 for the aforesaid purpose, each of said bonds to be in the denomination of \$1000.00 and \$528.00 and numbered consecutively from 1 to 3 and all made payable as follows:

February 1st, 1923

and bearing interest at the rate of 5% per annum payable semi-annually evidenced on coupons attached thereto. Said bonds shall be dated February 1st, 1920 and shall run for a period of three years, from date of issue and said bonds shall be payable at the office of the Sinking Fund Trustees of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Section 3. Said bonds shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued and that they are issued in pursuance of this ordinance. They shall be prepared, issued and delivered at the direction of the Finance Committee of the City Council and the City Auditor and sealed with the Corporate Seal of said City, and the interest coupons attached to said bonds shall be executed by the City Auditor with his signature printed or lithographed thereon.

Section 4. Said bonds shall be first offered at par and accrued interest to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund in their official capacity and if the Sinking Fund Trustees refuse to take any or all of said bonds at par and interest, then said bonds not so taken shall be offered at par and accrued interest to the Board of Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City School District, and if the Board of Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City School District refuse to take any or all of said bonds at par and interest, then said bonds not so taken shall be offered in writing at par and accrued interest to the Industrial Commission of the State of Ohio, and such of said bonds as are not taken shall be advertised for public sale and sold in the manner provided by law, but not for less than their par value and accrued interest.

Section 5. That the proceeds from such sale of said bonds except the premiums and accrued interest thereon shall be placed in the City Treasury to the credit of the \$380.00 sanitary sewer Fund No. 156, \$208.70 sanitary sewer Fund No. 177, \$1525.30 sanitary sewer No. 113-A, \$414.00 sanitary sewer Fund No. 176, and shall be disbursed upon proper vouchers for the purpose of paying the cost and expense of constructing sanitary sewers Nos. 156, 177, 176, 113-A, and for no other purpose. And the premiums and accrued interest received from such sale shall be transferred to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund to be applied by them in the manner provided by law.

Section 6. That for the purpose of paying the interest upon said bonds there shall be levied and assessed upon all taxable property in the City of Alliance, Ohio, an annual tax sufficient to raise the sum of \$126.40 or so much thereof as may be raised for said purpose. Said tax to continue so long as any of said bonds are outstanding and for the purpose of raising a Sinking Fund, there shall be levied and assessed each year while any of said bonds are outstanding, an annual tax sufficient to defeem said bonds at maturity.

Section 7. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and its enactment is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

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
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
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

Section . That it is the intent and meaning of this ordinance that the appropriations are made in the aggregate for the various classes of the disbursement indicated; that the items, the details of which are set forth under various classes of disbursements, are not severally appropriated, such being set forth only for the purpose of explaining how the aggregate of the class was reached. Fixed charges and contractual obligations shall be taken care of first; the remainder, if any, being subject to the discretion of the head of the department.

Section 10. That the City Auditor is hereby authorized to draw warrants upon the City Treasurer for the amounts appropriated in this ordinance whenever claims are presented, properly approved by the head of the department for which the indebtedness is legally incurred, provided that the Mayor shall approve all claims of the Humane Society Agent, and for the Municipal Concerts given by the Alliance City Band on the Public Square. The Judge and Clerk shall approve all claims of the Municipal Court.

RESOLUTION NO. 103-C

Mr. Weaver:

To provide for the issuance of bonds of the City of Alliance, in the sum of \$2675.00 for the purpose of extending the time of payment of certain indebtedness which from its limits of taxation the said city is unable to pay at maturity.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE,

STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION - 1. That certain indebtedness heretofore incurred by the City of Alliance, State of Ohio, to-wit:

Salaries due the employes of the Police and Fire department, employes of the Service Department and the Director of Safety and Service, to the amount of \$2675.00 is hereby determined and declared to be an existing, valid and binding obligation of said City.

SECTION - 2. To provide means to extend the time of payment of said indebtedness which from its limits of taxation of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio, is unable to pay at maturity, there shall be issued the bonds of the City of Alliance, to an aggregate amount of \$2675.00 for the aforesaid purpose, each of said bonds to be in the denomination of 5 for \$500.00, 1 for \$175.00 and numbered consecutively from 212 to 217, and all made payable as follows:

September 1st, 1924

and bearing interest at the rate of 6% per annum, payable semi-annually, evidenced by coupons attached thereto, said bonds shall be dated August 15th, 1920 and made payable at the office of the Sinking Fund Trustees of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

SECTION - 3. Said bonds shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued and that they are issued in pursuance of this ordinance. They shall be prepared, issued and delivered at the direction of the Finance Committee of the City Council and the City Auditor, and sealed with the Corporate Seal of said City, and the interest coupons attached to said bonds shall be executed by the City Auditor with his signature printed or lithographed thereon.

SECTION - 4. Said bonds shall be first offered at par and accrued interest to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund, in their official capacity and if the Sinking Fund Trustees refuse to take any or all of said bonds at par and interest, then said bonds not so taken shall be offered at par and accrued interest to the Board of Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City School District and if they refuse to take any or all of said bonds at par and interest, then said bonds not so taken shall be offered in writing at par and accrued interest to the Industrial Commission of the State of Ohio, and such of said bonds as are not so taken shall be advertised for public sale and sold in the manner provided by law, but not for less than their par value and accrued interest.

SECTION - 5. That the proceeds from the sale of said bonds except the premiums and accrued interest thereon shall be placed in the City Treasury to the credit of the Salary Fund and shall be disbursed upon proper vouchers for the purpose of paying the increase in the salaries of the Police and Fire Departments, employees of the Service Department, Director of Public Safety and Service as granted by Ordinance No. _____ passed by Council March 29th, 1920, and for no other purpose. And the premiums and accrued interest received from such sale shall be transferred to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund to be applied by them in the manner provided by law.

SECTION - 6. That for the purpose of paying the interest upon said bonds there shall be levied and assessed upon all taxable property in the City of Alliance, Ohio, an annual income tax sufficient to raise the sum of \$160.50 or so much thereof as may be raised for said purpose. Said tax to continue so long as any of said bonds are outstanding, and for the purpose of raising a Sinking Fund, there shall be levied and assessed each year while any of said bonds are outstanding, an annual tax that will raise such sum of money as will create a Sinking Fund sufficient to redeem said bonds at maturity.

SECTION - 7. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and its enactment is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare.

SECTION - 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 104-C

Mr. Ryan:

An Ordinance to levy special assessments for the improvement of Ohio Street from Woodland Avenue to Morgan Avenue by constructing Sanitary Sewer No. 177.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, OHIO:

SECTION - 1. That to pay the portion of the costs and expenses heretofore determined to be specially assessed for the improvement of Ohio Street from Woodland Avenue to Morgan Avenue by constructing Sanitary Sewer No. 177, there be levied and assessed upon the lots and lands the sum of \$2.03 per foot front of the property assessed upon said street between the termini of said improvement as above referred to; each of said lots and lands being found by Council and hereby declared to be benefited by said improvement in an amount not less than the assessment hereby levied upon the same.

SECTION - 2. That the total assessment against each lot shall be payable in cash within 30 days from the date of the final passage of this Ordinance, or in 6 semi-annual installments, with interest at the rate of five per cent per annum upon deferred payments, at the option of the owner. All installments of assessments shall be certified by the Clerk of Council to the County Auditor on or before the second Monday in September, annually to be by him placed upon the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes are collected.

SECTION - 3. That to provide a fund for the payment of the portion of the cost and expense for which the special assessments herein are levied for the improvement of Ohio Street from Woodland Avenue to Morgan Avenue by constructing Sewer No. 177 as aforesaid, the Mayor and Auditor be and they are herein authorized to issue bonds of the City of Alliance in the aggregate sum of \$1275.00 Twelve Hundred and Seventy-five Dollars, payable at the office of the Sinking Fund Trustees, dated August 15th, 1920, said bonds shall be of the denomination of 3 for \$425.00 and all made payable as follows:

\$ 425.00	September 1st, 1921
425.00	September 1st, 1922
425.00	September 1st, 1923

with interest on said bonds at the rate of five per cent per annum payable semi-annually, said bonds to be signed by the aforesaid officers, and sold by them as provided by law, and the proceeds thereof shall be applied to the payment of the cost and expense of said improvements as aforesaid, and to no other purpose whatsoever; and for the payment of said bonds, and the interest thereon, the revenue and faith and all real and personal property of the City of Alliance are hereby pledged; provided that if within the time above specified and before the sale of said bonds any owners of said property shall pay their total assessments in cash, the aggregate sum in bonds to be issued shall be reduced by deducting the amount so paid in cash from the total amount of the fund to be provided, and the bonds issued shall be severally reduced in amounts proportionately.

SECTION - 4. That upon the sale of said bonds the proceeds thereof, together with the moneys received, if any, from the cash payment of assessments shall be placed in the City Treasury, and disbursed upon proper vouchers in payment of the cost and expense of the improvements aforesaid.

That said bonds shall be designated as "Deficiency Bonds," shall be of the denomination of 54 for \$1,000.00 Dollars and one for \$600.00 and shall be dated November 15th, 1920, shall be drawn to Mature September 1st, 1928 and shall bear interest from the 15th day of November, 1920 at the rate of 6% per annum, payable semi-annually upon presentation and surrender of the attached coupons, executed by the City Auditor with his signature printed or lithographed thereon.

Section 4. That said bonds shall be prepared by the City Solicitor, signed by the Mayor and City Auditor, sealed with the city seal and recorded in the office of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund.
