Gentlemen-

We, the undersigned property holders, and residents of the City of Alliance, O. do hereby petition your respective body relative to certain street improvements herein designated to-wit:

The paving of South Liberty Avenue between Summit Street and Melvin Street respectively, in the City of Alliance and known as Improvement No. Ordinance No. passed by Council under date of August 3, 1891 and.

Whereas the said section of S. Liberty Ave. between said streets, viz. Summit Street and Melvin Street was previous to above said paving, placed to

Grade, Macadamized and curbed, and duly authorized assessment levied and collected from said property holders abutting streets, with the understanding of same being a permanent improvement, and:

Whereas the said section herein named, has since been paved under Ordinance No 594, making a second improvement with a second assessment placed upon the property holders, for the full amount to cover payment of same,

We the undersigned deem the collection of said assessment unfair and unjust and respectfully petition your Honorably body to make these assessments for the second improvement void; The paving of S. Liberty Ave. between Summit Street and Melius Street for amount we consider lawful and right, viz (Fifty per cent) 50% of said entire assessment in lieu of those originally levied against us, Eb Jones, C. Comroy, W. Stark, and others.

125 cars of curbs had been received and plank, and cars were arriving at the rate of 5 cars daily and it was the aim to complete the improvement this year. As to the cost of electric lights such as are used in front of the First National Bank, a number of which council had in view of placing, the sewer director reported as to expensive to justify their procuring at the present time.

The Sealer of Weights and Measures submitted an oral report of the work he had done since this department was established. And he estimated that the sum of \$12,000.00 had been saved to the people.
