Enclose you herewith petition for the extension of the Storm Sewer now being erected from Walnut Street Northward. As a matter of public health of public necessity and for the protection of property along this route from further damage, this improvement is urgently requested. At the storm yesterday and at numerous other rains, the damage from this open sewer have been considerable. We have had this before the council at previous times, and we can not answer for future damages that the city will be called upon to settle if it is not properly taken care of promptly. The expense of the extension as requested in the petition will not exceed \$1500, and the necessity is much greater than the part already arranged for.

I hope you will give this your best attention and get some favorable action taken.

Your present plans call for a storm sewer to be built from Milner Street North through an alley of the L. E. & W. R. R. to a point on the south line of H. C. Gentlemen.

We your committee on Sewers, Railroads after careful investigation of the conditions complained of by the Lumber, builder Supply, Coal Co. on the conditions of the water course on Simpson St. beg to report that it seems to us that the L.C.A.W. R.R. Co have changed the water course somewhat when they put in their switch which is known as the Morgan switch. Also when they put in the switch for the Builders Supply, Coal Co.

Therefore we recommend that the City Engineer be instructed to look the matter over and determine what is the best way to take care of the above water course and who will be benefited by the same as we think the L.C.A.W. R.R. Co should stand a part of the improvement.

The Com. on Sewers and Railroads report on the complaint of The Lumber, builder Supply and Coal Co.

Also the Lumber, Builders Supply, Coal Co. should stand a part of the expense, as they are on very low ground and away the below the grade. We ask that the Engineer make plans and estimate cost for the above improvement and submit same to council.
