The minutes of the previous meeting was read and approved. A communication was received and read from W.A. Carr, Director of Public Safety Doyle, called the attention of council to the condition of the Cemetery fund. The collection were falling off, and there were not sufficient funds to meet the demands. He recommended the borrow of \$500.00 for a short time.

Gentlemen -

Your committee to whom was referred the communication of W.A. Carr beg leave to report that we have met with the parties interested and find as follows.

1. That Mr Kellogg had a right to change his vote on the question at issue, in accordance with best authorities.

2. Mr Carr is mistaken when he states that the grade of Seneca Avenue was passed at a special meeting called to consider other matters only.
