There has been considerable discussion about making some change of grade on North Union Avenue, and we beg to suggest that if any such change is to be made it should be done at once, otherwise the company will be obliged to build its track on the present grade, as required by the City Ordinance, and will expect that it will not be put to any expense for any change of location of its road bed after it is once properly laid.
