Ordinance Number 49 D.

An Ordinance providing certain rules and regulations as to the use of streets, alleys and public places in the city of Alliance by vehicles.

Be It Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance, Ohio

Section 1. (a) All vehicles when stopped upon the public highway shall be so placed that the right wheels of such vehicle shall not be more than 12 inches from the right edge or curb of such highway, unless such access to the curb shall be obstructed, in which event said vehicle shall be stopped only for the purpose of loading or unloading passengers or merchandise and then only for the time so required; and all operators or drivers of vehicles selling or delivering commodities shall serve their patrons from the right hand edge or curb of the highway only. An exception to the provisions of this section is hereinafter set forth in the regulations as to 45 degree angle parking.

(b) No motor vehicle shall be left unattended with engine running for a period exceeding three minutes.

(c) Drive On Right Side Of Highway. On all occasions the operator of a vehicle on a public highway shall operate same on the right half of such highway, unless it is impracticable to travel on such side of the highway. And except when overtaking or passing other vehicles, in which case the vehicle may be operated on the left side of the highway if such left side is unobstructed and visible for at least one hundred yards ahead. In crossing intersections of highways or railway rights of way, the operator of a vehicle shall at all times cause such vehicle to travel on the right half of such highway or right of way unless such right side is obstructed or impassable.

(d) Meeting Of Vehicles. Vehicles proceeding in opposite directions shall pass each other to the right, each giving to the other one half the road as nearly as possible, and no other vehicle to the rear of such two vehicles shall pass or attempt to pass such two vehicles.

(e) Overtaking a Vehicle. A vehicle overtaking another vehicle proceeding in the same direction shall pass at least one foot to the left thereof, and shall not again drive to the right side of the highway until reasonably clear of such overtaken vehicle. It shall be the duty of an operator of a vehicle about to be overtaken and passed to give way to the right in favor of the overtaking vehicle. No operator of any other vehicle shall operate or drive the same so as to pass or overtake any other vehicle going in the same direction at any highway intersection unless directed to do so by a traffic officer.

(f) Turning Round Center of an Intersection. The operator of a vehicle approaching an intersection of a public highway with the intention of turning thereat, shall, in turning to the right, keep to the right edge or curb of the highway, and in turning to the left at such intersection shall run beyond the center of such intersection, passing to the right thereof, before turning such vehicle to left. For the purpose of this subdivision the center of such intersection shall be held to mean the meeting point of the medial lines of the highways intersecting each other. No vehicle, except a vehicle operated by the fire or police department, shall be turned so as to proceed in the opposite direction except at an intersection of a street, alley or end of dead end street, unless and except such turn can be made without backing. This provision as to turning, however, shall not apply except in a "business district."

(g) Slowing Moving Vehicle Keep To The Right. The operator of a vehicle moving slowly along or upon any public highway shall keep such vehicle as close as practicable to the right hand boundary or curb of the highway allowing more swiftly moving vehicles reasonably free passage to the left.

(h) Right of Way. The operator of a vehicle shall yield the right of way at the intersection of their paths, except at alleys and private driveways, to a vehicle approaching from the right.

(i) Signal Before Turning. Before turning, stopping or starting, or changing the course,

on a highway of any vehicle, and before turning such vehicle when starting the same, it shall be the duty of the operator thereof to first ascertain whether there is sufficient space for such movement to be made in safety and if the operation of other vehicles may be reasonably affected by such turning, stopping, starting or changing of course; when it is the intention of turning to the left or to stop, the operator or driver shall extend or wave the hand or give some visible signal of such intention.

(j) Stopping Behind Street Cars. The operator of any vehicle shall, upon overtaking any street car or interurban railway car which is stopped for the purpose of discharging or taking on passengers, stop such vehicle at least ten feet in the rear of the nearest exit of such street car or interurban railway car and keep such vehicle standing there so stopped until the passengers have alighted and reached the curb or place of safety or boarded said car. Vehicles, however, have the right to pass stopped street or interurban railway cars at terminal and layover points.

(k) Park Six Feet From Fire Hydrant. No person shall permit or allow a vehicle to stand at any time upon the public highway within six feet of a public fire hydrant or fire station located upon the public highway or sidewalk, unless such vehicle is occupied by and in the charge of some person capable of operating the same. Upon the approach of any apparatus of the fire department of the City of Alliance, responding to a call, upon the sounding of the siren or bell thereof, the driver of any vehicle shall immediately drive close to the right hand curb and stop. All fire apparatus, police cars and ambulances shall conform to the regular speed limitations when returning from a fire call, emergency police call or from the hospital. No vehicle shall be wheel locked upon any street or alley in the business district.

Section -2. Parking Generally. Parking of vehicles is prohibited on East Market Street between South Linden Avenue and South Freedom Avenue; on South Freedom Avenue between East

Market St. ^{2d} & alley south of the Public Square ;
 on South Liberty Avenue between East Main
 Street ^{2d} & Ash Street ; on South Arch Ave.
 from East Main Street to the first alley south
 of East Main Street ; on the south side of
 East Main Street from Liberty Ave. to the right
 of way of the Pennsylvania Railway Company ; on the
 North side of East Market Street from South
 Freedom Ave. to the first alley East of South
 Freedom Ave. ; on the south side of East
 Cambridge Street from the southeast corner of
 East Cambridge Street ^{2d} & South Linden Avenue to a
 point fifty feet easterly therefrom ; on the north
 side of East Cambridge Street from the northwest
 corner of East Cambridge Street ^{2d} & South Linden
 Ave. to a point fifty feet westerly therefrom ; on
 the East side of South Linden Ave. from the
 southeast corner of South Linden Ave. ^{2d} & East
 Cambridge Street to a point fifty feet southerly
 therefrom ; ^{2d} on the west side of South Linden
 Ave. from the northwest corner of South Linden Ave.
^{2d} & East Cambridge St. to a point fifty feet
 northerly therefrom ; parking of vehicles on the
 north side of East Broadway Street ; on the
 East side of North Freedom Avenue from East
 Main Street to Warehouse Street, on the East
 side of North Linden Ave. from East Main Street
 to the first alley north of East Main Street ; on
 the East side of Park Avenue from High Street to
 East Main Street ^{2d} on the East side of North
 Park Ave. from East Main St. to East Prospect
 St. shall be at an angle not exceeding 45 degrees.
 All vehicles shall at all times be so placed so as
 to be clear of cross walks. Motor vehicles shall not
 be parked on the north side of East Main Street
 from the right of way of the Pennsylvania Railway
 Company to within six feet of the first fire
 hydrant west from said right of way for a
 period longer than thirty minutes and shall be
 so placed that the rear wheels of each vehicle
 shall rest against the north curb of East Main
 Street. Vehicles shall not be parked or allowed
 to stand or wait on East Main Street East of
 Mechanic Ave. for a longer period than one
 hour between the hours of noon ^{2d} & 9:00 P.M. on
 Saturdays. Trade wagons, drays or moving
 vans shall not be parked or stopped upon
 East Main Street except for the purpose of
 loading ^{2d} & unloading of merchandise or other
 articles ^{2d} & then only for the time so required ; and
 no vehicle shall remain backed up to the
 curb except when it is actually loading or
 unloading ^{2d} & if horse drawn ^{2d} & with four

whenever the horse shall be turned at right angles to the vehicle and faced in the direction of the traffic on that side of the street. And in the event of said vehicle blocking the street car traffic the driver of said vehicle shall, when so requested, immediately remove the vehicle so as not to obstruct the street car traffic. Vehicle in parking shall do so nearly as possible to the street intersection or vehicle in front but not so close as to prevent free egress of such vehicle in front. The Director of Public Safety shall have proper signs prepared and set up at all places where parking of vehicle is in any way restricted; said signs to plainly state the facts as to such parking and shall be set up in a conspicuous place and no other signs relating to parking shall be posted or set up by any person or persons whomsoever.

Section - 3. Throwing Things on Highway. No person shall throw, deposit, drop or permit to be thrown, deposited or dropped, any glass, bottle, nail, tack, wire, cans or other substance likely to injure any person, animal or vehicle upon any public highway. It shall be the duty of any person who drops or permits any destructive or injurious material to be dropped or thrown on the highway to immediately remove or cause the same to be removed.

Section - 4. Whenever an officer is unable to find or locate the driver of any vehicle who has violated any of the provisions of this ordinance, said officer shall attach to the said vehicle, in a conspicuous place thereof, a Red Tag having the following wording printed thereon: "You have violated the Traffic Ordinance; Report to the Chief of Police and present this tag." No advertising matter that is similar in form or color to the red tag used by the department under this section shall be placed on an automobile.

Section - 5. No bicycle, motor vehicle, horse drawn vehicle, cattle or horses shall be ridden, driven or led on the sidewalk of any street in the City of Alliance.

Section - 6. It shall be unlawful for any

person to drive or propel or to cause to be driven or propelled upon any street in the City of Alliance, any vehicle with any load or part of a load projecting more than four feet beyond the rear end of the body or carrying part of said vehicle, unless during the period between the hours of one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour before sunset there shall be firmly attached to the extreme end of such projected load or part of load, in such a way as to be plainly discernable to person approaching from the rear of such vehicle, a red flag twelve by eighteen inches in size, unless during the period of from one-half hour after sunset of any day to one-half hour before sunrise of the next succeeding day, there shall be a red light attached to the rear end of such projecting load or part of a load. The red light herein required shall be used ^{and carried as herein provided} in addition to any rear light or other red light required to be carried on any vehicle by the laws of the State of Ohio. ^{Section 7.} This use of muffler cutouts is prohibited on all motor vehicles and no motor vehicle shall be operated in the City of Alliance unless the exhaust thereof is properly and effectively muffled.

Section - 8. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Ten Dollars for the first offense and not exceeding Fifty Dollars for subsequent offenses.

Section - 9. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and that its enactment is necessary for the immediate preservation of public health, safety and welfare.

Section - 10. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances heretofore enacted relating to vehicle traffic, operation of buses or vehicles of any kind or description, excepting street cars and Ordinance Number 88-B relating to the issuing and revoking of licenses are hereby revoked.

Section - 11. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 54-0

Mr. Miller:

An ordinance amending ordinance No. 92-J, known as the Traffic Ordinance of the city of Alliance, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Alliance, state of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That paragraph two of Section 31 of Ordinance No. 92-J be amended to read as follows:

Upon East Main street, and upon all streets intersecting with East Main street from Main street north to the first alley, and upon all streets intersecting with East Main street from Main street south to the first alley, and upon State street from the first alley east of Union avenue to the intersection of Union avenue and the right of way of the New York Central Railway company, and upon Union avenue from the first alley north of State street to the first alley south of State street.

SECTION 2. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and its immediate enactment is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare for the reason that the sections on State street and Union avenue have grown into business sections, and it is impossible to secure parking space for drivers of motor vehicles on such streets at said points.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Declaring it necessary to improve South Union Avenue between Main Street and State Street by surface treatment with Tarvia "B" .

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO, THREE-FOURTHS OF ALL MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO, CONCURRING:

Section - 1. That it is necessary to improve South Union Avenue from Main Street to State Street in the following manner: by surface treatment with Tarvia "B" .

Section - 2. That the grade of street as improved shall be the grade established by Ordinance passed August 5th, 1899 and that the grade of the curbs shall be conformed to intersecting grades.

Section - 3. That the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement heretofore prepared by the Engineer and now on file in the office of the Director of Public Service, be and the same are hereby approved.

Section - 4. That the whole cost of said improvement less $\frac{1}{2}$ thereof shall be assessed; by the foot front, upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be especially benefited by said improvement, and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of the preliminary and other surveys and all printing and publishing of notices resolutions and ordinances required, and the serving of said notices, the cost of construction, together with interest on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments and all other necessary expenditures.

ORDINANCE NO. 18-D

Mr. H. T. Miller:

An ordinance to establish a grade on West State Street from Rockhill Avenue to the West Corporation Line.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION - 1. That the grade on West State Street from Rockhill Avenue to West Corporation Line be established to read as follows:

Beginning at the old corporation line (south) at State Street at an elevation of 226.24; thence west 63 feet to the E. C. L. Rockhill Avenue at an elevation of 225.40; thence west to the W. C. L. of Rockhill Avenue to an elevation of 225.00; thence west to the E. C. L. of Parkway Boulevard (north) to an elevation of 205.00; thence west to the W. C. L. of Parkway Boulevard (north) to an elevation of 204.70; thence west to the E. C. L. of Parkway Boulevard (south) to an elevation of 207.7; thence west to the W. C. Whereas there has been presented to the Council a petition signed by ten per centum of the electors thereof praying for the submission to the electors of said city the question, "Shall a commission be chosen to frame a charter?" and the election of a commission to frame the same; and,

Whereas upon the presentation of said petition as aforesaid, it became the duty of this council forthwith to provide by ordinance for the submission of said question and the election of a commission in the manner and form as aforesaid:

Now, Therefore, be it ordained by the council of the city of Alliance, Ohio:

Sec. 1. That, pursuant to Section 8 of Article 18 of the Constitution of the State of Ohio, the question, "Shall a commission be chosen to frame a charter," be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the City of Alliance, Ohio, at a special election to be held on Tuesday the 29th day of March, 1921, at the regular places of voting in said city as established by the Board of Deputy State Supervisors and Inspectors of Elections of Stark County, Ohio, between the hours of 5:30 A.M. and 5:30 P.M. central standard time; that said question shall be submitted in the following manner of ballot, to-wit:

	: YES :	SHALL A COMMISSION BE CHOSEN
	: :	TO FRAME A CHARTER?

The elector shall indicate his intention to vote "yes" or "no" as the case may be by placing a cross mark in the blank enclosed space on the left of the words "yes" or "no" as it is his intention to vote.

Sec. 2. That the ballot, upon which the question provided for in Section 1 hereof shall be submitted, shall bear no party designation; it shall have printed thereon the names of all electors who shall have been nominated as provided in Section 3 hereof. In case a majority of the electors voting upon the question: "Shall a commission be chosen to frame a charter," shall have voted in the affirmative, then and in that event, and not otherwise, the fifteen electors who shall have received the greatest number of voted for members of such commission shall be and constitute a commission to frame a charter.

Sec. 3. All nominations for members of such commission shall be made by nomination papers signed by not less than 1% of the qualified electors of the City and shall be certified and filed in the same manner as is provided by law for the filing and certification of the nomination papers of candidates for municipal offices not less than twenty-five (25) days prior to the 29th day of March, 1921.

Sec. 4. The part of said ballot providing for said election of the members of the commission shall be prepared and printed as follows: The whole number of ballots to be printed for the municipality shall be divided by the number of candidates for members of the commission and the quotient so obtained shall be the number of ballots in each series of ballots to be printed. The names of candidates shall be arranged in alphabetical order, and the first series of ballots printed. Then the first name shall be placed last and the next series printed and so shall the process be repeated until each name shall have been first. These ballots shall then be combined in tablets, with no two of the same order of names together. At the top of the column of names of electors nominated shall be printed in separate space, the following: "Fifteen to be elected."

Section 5. The ballots shall be so printed as to give each elector a clear opportunity to designate by a cross mark in the blank enclosed space on the left and before the name of each candidate, his choice of the particular candidate. A cross shall be placed at the left of each candidate for whom the electors desire to vote.

They shall be prepared, issued and delivered at the direction of the Finance Committee of the City Council and the City Auditor and sealed with the Corporate Seal of said City, and the interest coupons attached to said bonds shall be executed by the City Auditor with his signature printed or lithographed thereon.

Section - 4. Said bonds shall be first offered at par and accrued interest to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund in their official capacity and if the Sinking Fund Trustees refuse to take any or all of said bonds offered at par and interest, then said bonds not so taken shall be offered at par and accrued interest to the Board of Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City School District and if the Board of Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City School District refuse to take any or all of said bonds at par and interest, then said bonds not so taken shall be offered in writing at par and accrued interest to the Industrial Commission of the State of Ohio, and such of said bonds as are not taken shall be advertised for public sale and sold in the manner provided by law, but not for less than their par value and accrued interest.

Section - 5. That the proceeds from such sale of said bonds except the premiums and accrued interest thereon shall be placed in the City Treasury to the credit of the following funds: S. Union Avenue Resurfacing, \$2176.00; West Cambridge repaving \$8201.00; West Harrison Street \$7696.00; North Garfield \$3116.00; West Cambridge St. \$3355.00; Parkway Blvd. Grant to Cambridge, \$3723.00; West State, Rockhill to Corp. line, \$12,780.00; Washington, Lincoln to Union, \$9173.00; E. State, Liberty to Mahoning, \$17,331.30; River St. Improvement, \$3951.00; Watson Avenue \$2600.00; Parkway Blvd. Hillcrest to State, \$51,558.10; Sewer #172, \$960.00; Sewer # 179, \$330.00, and shall be disbursed upon proper vouchers for the purpose of paying the City's portion of improving the following streets: S. Union Avenue, West Cambridge, West Harrison, North Garfield, Parkway Blvd., Grant to Cambridge, West Cambridge, West State, Washington Street, E. State, River St. Improvement, Watson Avenue, Parkway Blvd. Hillcrest to State, Sewer 172, Sewer 179, and for no other purpose. And the premiums and accrued interest received from such sale shall be transferred to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund to be applied by them in the manner provided by law.

Section - 6. That for the purpose of paying the interest upon said bonds there shall be levied and assessed upon all taxable property in the City of Alliance, Ohio, an annual tax sufficient to raise the sum of \$7560.00 or so much thereof as may be raised for said purpose. Said tax to continue so long as any of said bonds are outstanding, and for the purpose of raising a Sinking Fund, there shall be levied and assessed each year while any of said bonds are outstanding, an annual tax sufficient to redeem said bonds at maturity.

Section - 7. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and its enactment is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare.

Section - 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

An ordinance to levy special assessments for the improvement of Parkway Boulevard between Cambridge Street and Grant Street by grading, draining, curbing, and paving with bituminous macadam, reinforced concrete or brick block on slag or concrete base.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That to pay the portion of the costs and expenses heretofore determined to be specially assessed for the improvement of Parkway Boulevard between Cambridge Street and Grant Street by grading, draining, curbing and paving with bituminous macadam, reinforced concrete or brick block on slag or concrete base, there be levied and assessed upon the lots and lands the sum of \$8.76 per foot front of the property assessed upon said street between the termini of said improvement as above referred to; each of said lots and lands being found by Council and hereby declared to be benefited by said improvement in an amount not less than the assessment hereby levied upon the same.

SECTION 2. That the total assessment against each lot shall be payable in cash within 30 days from the date of the final passage of this ordinance, or in 14 semi-annual installments, with interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum upon deferred payments, at the option of the owner. All cash payments shall be made to the City Treasurer. ORDINANCE NUMBER 49-D

An Ordinance providing certain rules and regulations as to the use of streets, alleys and public places in the City of Alliance by vehicles.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE - OHIO.

Section 1. (a) All vehicles when stopped upon the public highway shall be so placed that the right wheels of such vehicle shall not be more than 12 inches from the right edge or curb of such highway, unless such access to the curb shall be obstructed, in which event said vehicle shall be stopped only for the purpose of loading or unloading passengers or merchandise and then only for the time so required; and all operators or drivers of vehicles selling or delivering commodities shall serve their patrons from the right hand edge or curb of the highway only. An exception to the provisions of this section is hereinafter set forth in the regulations as to 45 degree angle parking.

(b) No motor vehicle shall be left unattended with engine running for a period exceeding three minutes.

(c) DRIVE ON RIGHT SIDE OF HIGHWAY. On all occasions the operator of a vehicle on a public highway shall operate same on the right half of such highway, unless it is impracticable to travel on such side of the highway, and except when overtaking and passing other vehicles, in which case the vehicle may be operated on the left side of the highway if such left side is unobstructed and visible for at least one hundred yards ahead. In crossing intersections of highways or railway rights of way, the operator of a vehicle shall at all times cause such vehicle to travel on the right half of such highway or right of way unless such right side is obstructed or impassable.

(d) MEETING OF VEHICLES. Vehicles proceeding in opposite directions shall pass each other to the right, each giving to the other one half the road as nearly as possible, and no other vehicle to the rear of such two vehicles shall pass or attempt to pass such two vehicles.

(e) OVERTAKING A VEHICLE. A vehicle overtaking another vehicle proceeding in the same direction shall pass at least one foot to the left thereof, and shall not again drive to the right side of the highway until reasonably clear of such overtaken vehicle. It shall be the duty of an operator of a vehicle about to be overtaken and passed to give way to the right in favor of the overtaking vehicle. No operator of any other vehicle shall operate or drive the same so as to pass or overtake any other vehicle going in the same direction at any highway intersection unless directed to do so by a traffic officer.

(f) TURNING ROUND CENTER OF AN INTERSECTION. The operator of a vehicle approaching an intersection of a public highway with the intention of turning thereat, shall, in turning to the right, keep to the right edge or curb of the highway, and in turning to the left at such intersection shall run beyond the center of such intersection, passing to the right thereof, before turning such vehicle to left. For the purpose of this subdivision the center of such intersection shall be held to mean the meeting point of the medial lines of the highways intersecting each other. No vehicles, except a vehicle operated by the fire or police department, shall be turned so as to proceed in the opposite direction except at an intersection of a street, alley or end of dead end street, unless and except such turn can be made without backing. This provision as to turning, however, shall not apply except in a "business district."

(g) SLOWLY MOVING VEHICLES KEEP TO THE RIGHT. The operator of a vehicle moving slowly along or upon any public highway shall keep such vehicle as close as practicable to the right hand boundary or curb of the highway allowing more swiftly moving vehicles reasonably free passage to the left.

(h) RIGHT OF WAY. The operator shall yield the right of way at the intersection of their paths, except at alleys and private driveways, to a vehicle approaching from the right.

(i) SIGNAL BEFORE TURNING. Before turning, stopping or starting or changing the course on a highway of any vehicle, and before turning such vehicle when starting the same, it shall be the duty of the operator thereof to first ascertain whether there is sufficient space for such movement to be made in safety and if the operation of other vehicles may be reasonably affected by such turning, stopping, starting or changing of course; when it is the intention of turning to the left or to stop, the operator or driver shall extend or wave the hand or give some visible signal of such intention.

(j) STOPPING BEHIND STREET CARS. The operator of any vehicle shall, upon overtaking any street car or interurban railway car which is stopped for the purpose of discharging or taking on passengers, stop such vehicle at least ten feet in the rear of the nearest exit of such street car or interurban railway car and keep such vehicle standing there so stopped until the passengers have alighted and reached the curb or place of safety or boarded said car. Vehicles, however, have the right to pass stopped street or interurban railway cars at terminal and layover points.

(k) Park SIX FEET FROM FIRE HYDRANT. No person shall permit or allow a vehicle to stand at any time upon the public highway within six feet of a public fire hydrant or fire station located upon the public highway or sidewalk, unless such vehicle is occupied by and in the charge of some

person capable of operating the same. Upon the approach of any apparatus of the fire department of the City of Alliance, responding to a call, upon the sounding of the siren or bell thereof, the driver of any vehicle shall immediately drive close to the right hand curb and stop. All fire apparatus, police cars and ambulances shall conform to the regular speed limitations when returning from a fire call, emergency police call or from the hospital. No vehicle shall be wheel locked upon any street or alley in the business district.

Section 2. PARKING GENERALLY. Parking of vehicles is prohibited on East Market Street between South Linden Avenue and South Freedom Avenue; on South Freedom Avenue between East Market St. and alley South of the Public Square; on South Liberty Avenue between East Main Street and Ash Street; on South Arch Ave. from East Main Street to the first alley South of East Main Street; on the South side of East Main Street from Liberty Ave. to the right of way of the Pennsylvania Railway Company; on the North side of East Market Street from South Freedom Ave. to the first alley East of South Freedom Avenue; on the South side of East Cambridge Street from the Southeast corner of East Cambridge Street and South Linden Avenue to a point fifty feet easterly therefrom; on the North side of East Cambridge Street from the Northwest corner of East Cambridge Street and South Linden Ave. to a point fifty feet westerly therefrom; on the East side of South Linden Ave. from the Southeast corner of South Linden Ave. and East Cambridge Street to a point fifty feet Southerly therefrom; and on the West side of South Linden Ave. from the Northwest corner of South Linden Ave. and East Cambridge St. to a point fifty feet Northerly therefrom; parking of vehicles on the North side of East Broadway Street; on the East side of North Freedom Avenue from East Main Street to Warehouse Street; on the East side of North Linden Ave. from East Main Street to the first alley North of East Main Street; on the East side of Park Avenue from High Street to East Main Street and on the East side of North Park Ave. from East Main Street to East Prospect Street shall be at an angle not exceeding 45 degrees. All vehicles shall at all times be so placed so as to be clear of cross walks. Motor vehicles shall not be parked on the North side of East Main Street from the right of way of the Pennsylvania Railway Company to within six feet of the first fire hydrant West from said right of way for a period longer than thirty minutes and shall be so placed that the rear wheels of each vehicle shall rest against the North curb of East Main Street. Vehicles shall not be parked or allowed to stand or wait on East Main Street East of Mechanic Ave. for a longer period than one hour between the hours of noon and 9:00 P.M. on Saturdays. Trade wagons, drays or moving vans shall not be parked or stopped upon East Main Street except for the purpose of loading and unloading of merchandise or other articles and then only for the time so required; and no vehicle shall remain backed up to the curb except when it is actually loading or unloading and if horse drawn and with four wheels the horse shall be turned at right angles to the vehicle and faced in the direction of the traffic on that side of the street. And in the event of said vehicle blocking the street car traffic the driver of said vehicle shall, when so requested, immediately remove the vehicle so as not to obstruct the street car traffic. Vehicles in parking shall do so nearly as possible to the street intersection or vehicle in front but not so close as to prevent free egress of such vehicle in front. The Director of Public Safety shall have proper signs prepared and set up at all places where parking of vehicles is in any way restricted; said signs to plainly state the facts as to such parking and shall be set up in a conspicuous place and no other signs relating to parking shall be posted or set up by any person or persons whomsoever.

Section 3. THROWING THINGS ON HIGHWAY. No person shall throw, deposit, drop or permit to be thrown, deposited or dropped, any glass, bottles, nails, tacks, wire, cans or other substance likely to injure any person, animal or vehicle upon any public highway. It shall be the duty of any person who drops or permits any destructive or injurious material to be dropped or thrown on the highway to immediately remove or cause the same to be removed.

Section 4. Whenever an officer is unable to find or locate the driver of any vehicle who has violated any of the provisions of this ordinance, said officer shall attach to the said vehicle, in a conspicuous place thereof, a Red Tag having the following wording printed thereon; "You have violated the Traffic Ordinance; Report to the Chief of Police and present this tag." No advertising matter that is similar in form or color to the red tags used by the department under this section shall be placed on an automobile.

Section 5. No bicycle, motor vehicle, horse drawn vehicle, cattle or horses shall be ridden, driven or led on the sidewalks of any street in the City of Alliance.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or propel or to cause or to permit to be driven or propelled upon any street in the City of Alliance, any vehicle with any load or part of a load projecting more than four feet beyond the rear end of the body or carrying part of said vehicle, unless during the period between the hours of onehalf hour before sunrise to onehalf hour before sunset there shall be firmly attached to the extreme end of such projected load or part of load, in such a way as to be plainly discernable to person approaching from the rear of such vehicles, a

red flag twelve by eighteen inches in size, and unless during the period of from one-half hour after sunset of any day to one-half hour before sunrise of the next succeeding day, there shall be a red light attached to the rear end of such projecting load or part of a load. The red light herein required shall be used and carried as herein provided in addition to any rear light or other red light required to be carried on any vehicle by the laws of the State of Ohio.

Section 7. The use of muffler cutouts is prohibited on all motor vehicles and no motor vehicle shall be operated in the City of Alliance unless the exhaust thereof is properly and effectively muffled.

Section 8. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Ten Dollars for the first offense and not exceeding Fifty Dollars for subsequent offenses.

Section 9. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and that its enactment is necessary for the immediate preservation of public health, safety and welfare.

Section 10. All ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore enacted relating to vehicle traffic, operation of busses or vehicles of any kind or description, excepting street cars and ordinance Number 88-B relating to the issuing and revoking of licenses are hereby revoked.

Section 11. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 6. There shall be levied and collected annually during the period for which said bonds are to run by taxation on all taxable property on the tax duplicate of the City of Alliance an amount sufficient to pay the interest thereon as herein provided and to provide a sinking fund for the payment of said bond at maturity; provided that the amount of such annual levy shall be such as to provide for and make up any deficiency in the revenues of said city available for the payment of such interest and the creation of such sinking fund, for the collection of said or any special assessment hereafter levied in lieu thereof, or otherwise; and the proper taxing authorities shall compute the amount of such general tax levies and certify the same for collection as other taxes are certified and collected.

SECTION 7. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
