Mr. Gubb. Declaring it necessary to complete the improvement of East State street between Arch Avenue and Union Avenue by curbing and paving with brick blocks was read the first time.

Mr. Gubb. Declaring it necessary to improve E State street between Arch Avenue and Liberty Avenue by grading, curbing and paving with brick blocks was read the first time.
