Alliance, O.

Gentlemen,

The Stark Electric Railroad Company asks us to inform you that the material for the switch on State Street between Union Avenue and Clark Avenue is here and ready to be put in as soon as the frost is out of the ground, which construction is necessary so that the company may operate its cars to the Rockhill Road on a fifteen-minute schedule.

The Company also authorizes us to say that it will waive the question of the cost of repaving State Street from Clark Avenue to Union Avenue and agrees to pay the full cost of paving the same between the rails of its two tracks along this switch and nine inches on each side thereof, as provided in its franchise.

We hope that this street may be paved to sufficient width to make it right for all kinds of traffic, and that the construction of the switch and the repaving may proceed without unnecessary inconvenience to the public.
