The committee on water submitted their on the stand pipe with the following recommendations.

The Honorable City Council.

Gentlemen:- The Water Committee to whom together with the Director of Public Service was referred the matter of investigation as to the condition of the Arch Ave stand pipe beg to report, as follows:

That we have had an examination as to the physical condition and strength of the stand pipe made by two competent structural and engineering firms both of whom report unfavorable to the use of the stand pipe in its present condition. One of these reports gives no statement as to the strength of the material based on measurements and tests of the iron. The other does give a detailed report in this particular based on measurements and a test of the tensile strength of a test piece taken from what appeared to be the part showing greatest deterioration which shows that the stand pipe in its present condition with all defective rivets renewed has a factor of safety slightly in excess of $2\frac{1}{2}$ times the maximum stress estimated to be placed upon it in actual service which is less than is considered good practice in such construction and use. They further recommend however that if all defective rivets be repaired and the height of the stand pipe be reduced about 30 feet that the factor of safety will be increased to near 4 which we understand to be within the limits of good practice for such service.

We therefore recommend that the stand pipe be at once repaired by renewing all defective rivets and that the height be reduced to such extent as shall be necessary to make it safe for use in accordance with the rules of good practice in stand pipe construction.
