Referred to Judiciary Committee.

Ord. No. 1482

Mr. Lower. An ordinance providing for the regulating of moving buildings and placing other obstructions on and across the streets and alleys of the City of Alliance, O. and for providing information relating thereto to the Chief of the Fire Department of said city.

Referred to com. on Streets, Alleys & Fire, Patrol.

Ord. No. 1480

Mr. Lower. To vacate that portion of the first alley running parallel with and south of West Main Street from the west line of Main Avenue in the City of Alliance, Ohio to its eastern terminal.

Referred to com. on Streets & Alleys

Voss arose to a question of personal privilege and stated ~~reasons~~ reasons why he vote on the Ordinances providing for specifications and 78% test for paving blocks, and stated that in his judgment the test should be changed.

Harriet Barnard introduced the following resolution

Res. No. 1484

To appoint a committee to fix a value upon the lots and lands abutting on Allen Street and S. Liberty Avenue not sub-divided into lots for the assessment of the improvement of said Allen Street

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio

Sec. 1. That the President of the council appoint a committee consisting of three members of council to fix and report to council for the purpose of making a special assessment of the payment of the improvement of said Allen Street. The lots and lands not sub-divided into lots, as provided for by Section 50a of the Municipal Code.

Sec. 2. That said Committee be directed to report to council at the next regular meeting thereof its ~~proposals~~ action and findings in the premise.

Harper moved seconded by Patton, that the resolution be adopted.

Which resolution was adopted.

Whereupon the President appointed Messrs. Voss, Patton & Barnard.
