The Special Committee appointed to fix the value of certain lots and lands for street improvement purposes submitted the following report.

To the President and Members of the Council of the City of Alliance, O.

Sir, the undersigned special committee, to whom was referred the matter of fixing the value by the foot front of certain lots and lands not subdivided into lots on Auld Street, to enable Council to fix, for the purpose of making special assessments by the foot front on said lots and lands, respectfully report that, in our judgment, for the purpose of making said special assessment and in order that said special assessment shall not exceed thirty three and one third per cent of the value of said lots and lands said lots and lands are of the value following.

Lots & lands.

1. The lands of The Alliance Machine Co., abutting on Auld Street, about 1821.6 less 300 feet, which we have allowed for streets and alleys, in case said lands may be hereafter platted and laid out in lots said lands not being subdivided in lots, to wit:
