We, your committee appointed to investigate the matter of the city purchasing a site for the proposed State Armory building beg leave to report that we have carefully considered the matter, and would respectfully recommend that the city purchase the lots at the corner of Oxford and Seneca Avenue, at a sum not to exceed \$5,500.00

We would further report that owing to the limitations imposed by the tax laws of Ohio on the amount that may be levied for interest and sinking fund purposes. That the question of issuing the bonds to purchase this site be submitted to the vote of the people at the next general election; and that the Solicitor is hereby instructed to prepare the necessary legislation to submit the same at the earliest possible moment.
