The Stark Electric Railroad Company hereby protests against the assessment which is proposed by the City Council on Vine Street as being entirely out of proportion to the benefits accruing to its abutting property. The proposed assessment against it for the pavement on and along its track seems in excess of the cost of the same, and in order to save the rights of our client we hereby protest against the same.

Petition to Vacate Street.

To the Honorable Council of the City of Alliance, O.

The undersigned owners of lots in the City of Alliance, Ohio abutting upon a stub or short end of a street, being known as the first street on the south side of State Street east of Shunk Avenue, and without name upon the city map of Alliance, Ohio and is located between lot number Three hundred and Seventy two (372) and three hundred and Seventy one (371) in said city, respectfully petition your Honorable Body that said street may be vacated between the south west line of State Street and the north line of the first alley south of State Street as hereinafter described, viz: That said street may be vacated between said point last above mentioned so that said street after said vacation will be left (Fifteen (15) feet in width so as to form an alley. The vacated square that said street be vacated as to the west Twenty two and one half (22 1/2) feet thereof and to the east

Twenty Two and one half (22 1/2) feet thereof between the south line of State street and the south line of the first alley south of State Street, thereby leaving a space Fifteen (15) feet in width as an alley shall not be vacated, but shall remain as a public alley in said city of Alliance, O.

Your petitioners further state that said street is no longer of use to the public in its present condition inasmuch as there has been an Avenue, viz.

Thurs Avenue platted, graded and laid out about Sixty (60) feet west of said proposed street to take the place of said street for which your petitioners request a vacation.

There will still remain an alley Fifteen (15) feet in width from State Street south, and the vacation of said portion of said street of a street will not be detrimental to the general interest whatsoever.
