

## Ordinance No. 144 D.

Mr. McCredie: -

An ordinance regulating traffic on East Main Street and Liberty Avenue in the city of Alliance, Ohio.

Whereas, East Main Street in the city of Alliance, Ohio is a dead end street and ends at the tracks of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company and has no outlet whatsoever to the east, and

Whereas, Liberty Avenue ends at East Main Street in the city of Alliance, Ohio, and has no outlet on the north side of Main Street, and

Whereas, all traffic coming to and from the Pennsylvania Depot and East Main Street and traffic crossing over the viaduct is required to pass through the intersection of Liberty and Main Street, and

Whereas, all taxi cabs traveling between the Pennsylvania Depot and other parts of the city as a matter of necessity use said street, and

Whereas, all cars of the Stark Electric Railway Company pass over said streets between the aforesaid points, and

Whereas, by reason of the above conditions said streets have become a congested district, rendering traveling hazardous and difficult, and

Whereas, certain owners and operators of automobile or jitney busses have invaded said territory for the purposes of parking, receiving and discharging passengers, thereby rendering the street unsafe to travel upon and greatly increasing the congestion within said area.

Now Therefore, Be It Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance, State Of Ohio:

Section 1. That from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm or firms, co-partnership or association, company or corporation, insofar as they own, control, operate or manage a motor vehicle or motor vehicles used exclusively for the transportation of passengers, excepting duly licensed taxicabs, to park, receive or discharge passengers to and from said motor vehicles, commonly known as busses, on East Main Street in the city of Alliance, Ohio, between Seneca Street and the Pennsylvania Depot, and on Liberty Avenue between Main Street and Cash Street in the city of Alliance, Ohio.

Section 2. The term "jitney" or "bus" shall be construed to mean all gasoline propelled motor vehicles carrying passengers for hire, except taxicabs, and the provisions of this ordinance shall apply to all persons while operating or in

charge of any trolley or bus, either as owner, agent or employee.

Section - 3. That any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall for a first offense be fined not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00, and for a second or subsequent offense shall be fined not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$300.00.

Section - 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and that its immediate enactment is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare.

Section - 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**ORDINANCE NO. 45-0**

Mr. M. R. Battey:  
An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 74-I regulating the operation of motor buses in the city of Alliance, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Alliance, state of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Section 10 of Ordinance No. 74-I shall read as follows: "That no bus or buses shall park on Main street except for the purpose of taking on and discharging passengers, and then only for such length of time as may be necessary to take on and discharge passengers, in no case to exceed thirty minutes."

SECTION 2. That Section 10 of Ordinance No. 74-I heretofore passed by the council of the city of Alliance is hereby repealed, but this ordinance shall in no way effect the balance of said ordinance.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

An ordinance requiring every physician or surgeon in the City of Alliance, Ohio, to report to Police Headquarters of the City of Alliance of the treatment of wounds inflicted by deadly weapons.

Be It Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance - State Of Ohio:

Section - 1. Every physician or surgeon duly admitted to the practice of medicine or surgery in the State of Ohio, whenever he shall treat any person in the City of Alliance for a gun-shot wound or wounds, or for any other wound or wounds which have been inflicted by a deadly weapon of whatsoever kind, shall notify the Police Department of the City of Alliance within one (1) hour of the time when he rendered such professional service or is called upon to render the same.

Section - 2. Whoever shall violate Section One (1) of this ordinance shall for each and every violation be deemed guilty of misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or imprisoned not more than thirty (30) days or both.

Section - 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

## Ordinance No. 88-A.

Mr. J. J. McCredie -

An ordinance requiring motor bus operators to file maps of their routes through the city of Alliance, Ohio, with the Director of Public Safety.

Now Therefore Be It Ordained By the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Section - 1. That every person, persons, firm, co-partnership, voluntary association, joint stock association, company or corporation, operating any motor vehicle or vehicles for the transportation of persons, within or through the territorial limits of the municipal corporation of Alliance, Ohio shall on or before the 15th day of June 1925, file with the Director of Public Safety a map showing their route, routes, or proposed route or routes, through the municipality.

Section - 2. That any person, persons, firm, co-partnership, voluntary association, joint stock association, company or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Section - 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and its immediate enactment is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section - 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

## Ordinance No. 76-H.

Mr. S. J. McCredie:-

An ordinance designating main thoroughfares in the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Be It Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance, State Of Ohio:

Section - 1. That for the purpose of enforcing traffic regulations in the City of Alliance, the following streets are hereby designated and declared to be main thoroughfares, and vehicles and street cars traveling on such main thoroughfares shall have the right of way over those traveling on streets which intersect said main thoroughfares: Union Avenue from Milton Street north to Vine Street; Arch Avenue from Milton Street north to Hester Avenue; Freedom Avenue from Waugh Street north to Warehouse Street; Main Street from Liberty Avenue west to Rockhill Road.

Section - 2. That all vehicles being operated or driven upon all streets intersecting the above designated main thoroughfares shall come to a full stop before crossing said main thoroughfares.

Section - 3. That whenever two main thoroughfares cross each other, the operator of a vehicle shall yield the right of way at the intersection of its path and the path of another vehicle to the vehicle approaching from the right.

Section - 4. Whoever violates any provision of this ordinance shall be fined not more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars, and for a second offense shall be fined not less than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

Section - 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore enacted, conflicting herewith are hereby repealed.

Section - 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

## Ordinance No. 106-H.

Mr. McCredie:-

An ordinance providing certain parking restrictions in the city of Alliance, Ohio.

Be It Ordained By The Council Of The City Of Alliance, State Of Ohio:-

Section - 1. Parking of vehicles is prohibited on the north side of Prospect Street from Freedom to Linden Avenue; and parking on Milner Street between Arch Avenue and Union Avenue is limited to one hour.

Section - 2. Any of the foregoing parking provisions may be changed or amended, if deemed necessary, or the occasion demands, by the Police Department and Police Committee.

Section - 3. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than \$50.00 or more than \$50.00.

Section - 4. All conflicting ordinances or parts of ordinance heretofore enacted relating to the parking of vehicles, are hereby repealed.

Section - 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

## RESOLUTION NO. 17-H

Mr. J. H. Miller:-

Declaring it necessary to improve Milton Street between Union Avenue and Liberty Avenue by Grading, draining, curbing and paving, forty-eight (48) feet.

WHEREAS, the owners of two-thirds in interest of the property abutting upon Milton Street between Union Avenue and Liberty Avenue have petitioned in writing for the improvement of said street between the points named by grading, draining, curbing and paving.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO, THREE FOURTHS OF ALL MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section - 1. That it is necessary to improve Milton street from Union Avenue to Liberty Avenue in the following manner by grading, draining, curbing and paving.

Section - 2. That the grade of street improved shall be the grade established by Ordinance passed February 5th, 1917 and that the grade of the curbs shall be conformed to intersecting grades.

Section - 3. That the plans specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvements heretofore prepared by the engineer and now on file in the office of the Director of Public Service, be and the same are hereby approved.

Section - 4. That the whole cost of said improvement less 1/50 thereof and the cost of intersections shall be assessed:

By the foot front.

Upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: all lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be especially benefited by said improvement, and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of the preliminary and other surveys, and all printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, and that serving of said notices, the cost of construction, together with interest on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments and all other necessary expenditures.

Section - 5. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in Twenty (20) semi-annual installments with interest on deferred payments at 6 percent per annum, provided that the owner of any property may, at this option, pay such assessments in cash within thirty (30) days from and after the passage of the assessing ordinance, in which case said assessment shall not include any item of interest upon bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred installments of assessments.

Section - 6. That the bonds or notes of the City of Alliance, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments and in an amount equal thereof.

Section - 7. That the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement not especially assessed including the cost of intersections, together with the cost of any real estate or interest therein purchased or appropriated and the cost and expense of any appropriation proceedings therefor, and the damages awarded any owner of adjoining lands and interest thereon and the cost and expense of any such award shall be paid out of the fund, (or by the issuance of bonds in the manner provided by law.)

Section - 8. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and its enactment is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare. The necessity therefore, lies in the fact that unless immediate legislation is provided therefore, such improvement can not be consummated before the winter months will necessitate the delay of making and finishing such improvement until the following summer much to the inconvenience and detriment of the public health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Section - 9. This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

## ORDINANCE NO. 144-G

Mr. McCredie:-

An ordinance regulating traffic on East Main Street and Liberty Avenue in the city of Alliance, Ohio.

WHEREAS, East Main Street in the city of Alliance, Ohio, is a dead end street and ends at the tracks of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company and has no outlet whatsoever to the east, and

WHEREAS, Liberty Avenue ends at East Main Street in the city of Alliance, Ohio and has no outlet on the north side of Main Street, and

WHEREAS, all traffic coming to and from the Pennsylvania Depot on East Main Street and traffic crossing over the viaduct is required to pass through the intersection of Liberty and Main Street, and

WHEREAS, all taxi cabs traveling between the Pennsylvania Depot and other parts of the city as a matter of necessity use said street, and

WHEREAS, all cars of the Stark Electric Railway Company pass over said streets between the aforesaid points, and

WHEREAS, by reason of the above conditions said streets have become a congested district, rendering traveling hazardous and difficult, and

WHEREAS, certain owners and operators of automobile or jitney busses have invaded said territory for the purposes of parking, receiving and discharging passengers, thereby rendering the street unsafe to travel upon and greatly increasing the congestion within said area,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section - 1. That from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm or firms, copartnership or association, company or corporation, insofar as they own, control, operate or manage a motor vehicle or motor vehicles used exclusively for the transportation of passengers, excepting duly licensed taxicabs, to park, receive or discharge passengers to and from said motor vehicles, commonly known as busses, on East Main Street in the city of Alliance, Ohio, between Seneca Street and the Pennsylvania Depot, and on Liberty Avenue between Main Street and Ash Street in the city of Alliance, Ohio.

Section - 2. The term 'Jitney' or 'bus' shall be construed to mean all gasoline propelled motor vehicles carrying passengers for hire, except taxicabs, and the provisions of this ordinance shall apply to all persons while operating or in charge of any jitney or bus, either as owner, agent or employee.

Section - 3. That any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall for a first offense be fined not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00 and for a second or subsequent offense shall be fined not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$300.00.

Section - 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and that its immediate enactment is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare.

Section - 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2-H<sup>117</sup>

Mr. H. D. Miller:-

An ordinance providing for the issuance of bonds of the city of Alliance in the sum of (\$1200.00) Twelve Hundred Dollars, for the purpose of purchasing fire hose for the Fire Department of the city of Alliance, Ohio.

WHEREAS, this council has requested the City Auditor to issue his certificate as to the estimated life of the property, asset or improvement proposed to be acquired or constructed from the proceeds of the bonds hereinafter referred to and the City Auditor has certified to this council such estimated life as ten (10) years and has further certified the maximum maturity of such bonds as ten (10) years, and

WHEREAS, the subject matter herein provided for constitutes an emergency providing for the immediate preservation of public property, health and safety and providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO.

Section - 1. That it is deemed necessary to issue the bonds of the city of Alliance in the principal sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1200.00), in order to provide a fund for the purpose of purchasing fire hose for the Fire Department of the City of Alliance.

Section - 2. That bonds of the city of Alliance shall be issued in the principal sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) for the purpose aforesaid. Said bonds shall be numbered Number One and said bonds shall be dated February 15th, 1925, and shall bear interest at the rate of 5 per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the 15th day of August and February of each year until the principal sum is paid. Said bonds shall mature as follows: February 15th, 1926, which maturities are hereby determined to be in substantially equal annual installments. The interest and principal on all of said bonds shall be payable at the office of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund of the city of Alliance, State of Ohio.

Section 3. That said bonds shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued; that they are issued in pursuance of this ordinance and shall be signed by the Mayor and Auditor, and sealed with the corporate seal of said city. The interest coupons attached to said bonds shall bear the facsimile signature of the City Auditor.

Section 4. That for the purpose of providing the necessary funds to pay the interest on the foregoing issue of bonds, promptly when, and as the same falls due and also to provide a fund sufficient to discharge the said serial bonds at maturity, there shall be and is hereby levied on all the taxable property in said city of Alliance, in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually during the period said bonds are to run in an amount sufficient to provide funds to pay interest upon said bonds as and when the same falls due and also to provide a fund for the discharge of the principal of said serial bonds at maturity, which tax shall be not less than the interest and sinking fund tax required by Section II of Article XII of the Constitution.

Said tax shall be and is hereby ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of said years are certified, extended and collected. Said tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The funds derived from said tax levies hereby required shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which together with all interest collected on the same, shall be irrevocably pledged for the payment of the interest and principal of said bonds when and as the same falls due.

Section - 5. The proceeds from the sale of said bonds, except the premium and accrued interest thereon and the amount of said bonds issued for interest, shall be used for the purpose aforesaid and for no other purpose; the premium and accrued interest received from such sale and the amount of said bonds issued for interest shall be transferred to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund to be applied by them in the payment of the principal and interest of said bonds in the manner provided by law.

Section - 6. The City Auditor is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this ordinance to the County Auditor as required by Section 5649-1B of the General Code.

Section - 7. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

That it is deemed necessary to issue the bonds of the city of Alliance in the principal sum of Fifteen Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$1550.00) in order to provide a fund for the purpose of paying the cost and expense of the Citys Portion of constructing Sanitary Sewer 189-A and South Freedom Avenue from Carrs Alley to College Street by grading.

Section - 2. That bonds of the city of Alliance shall be issued in the principal sum of Fifteen Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1550.00) for the purpose aforesaid. Said bonds shall be numbered No. I. Bonds shall be dated March 1st 1925 and shall bear interest at the rate of 5 per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of March and September of each year until the principal sum is paid, ~~Said bonds shall mature as follows;~~ except that the first coupon shall provide for the payment of interest from March 1st 1925 to March 1st, 1926. Said bonds shall mature as follows: September 1st, 1926, which maturities are hereby determined to be in substantially equal annual installments.

The interest and principal on all of said bonds shall be payable at the office of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund of the city of Alliance, State of Ohio.

Section - 3. That said bonds shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued; that they are issued in pursuance of this ordinance and shall be signed by the Mayor and Auditor, and sealed with the corporate seal of said city. The interest coupons attached to said bonds shall bear the facsimile signature of the City Auditor.

Said tax shall be and is hereby ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of said years are certified, extended and collected. Said tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The funds derived from said tax levies hereby required shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which together with all interest collected on the same, shall be irrevocably pledged for the payment of the interest and principal of said bonds when and as the same falls due.

Section - 5. The proceeds from the sale of said bonds, except the premium and accrued interest thereon and the amount of said bonds issued for interest, shall be used for the purpose aforesaid and for no other purpose; the premium and accrued interest received from such sale and the amount of said bonds issued for interest shall be transferred to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund to be applied by them in payment of the principal and interest of said bonds in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, the subject matter herein provided for constitutes an emergency providing for the immediate preservation of public property, health and safety and providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department.






