TO THE HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL.

ALLIANCE, OHIO.

We the Water Committee of Council to whom was referred
the petition of property owners on South Union Avenue, extended,
for the privilege of constructing a water main, south from the
South corporation line on Union avenue and connecting same with
the water main of the City of Alliance, Ohio, in accordance with
the proposition contained therein as to payment of expenses,
water rentals and conditions of service, beg to recommend as
follows:

That the proposition embodied in said petition be
accepted on the conditions stated therein and as follows:- All
expenses of constructing such water line, and the installation of
service lines and meters for connecting thereto shall be paid by
the property owners using said line, all water to be furnished
from such line be furnished by meter measure only, and the rates
charged therefor be the same as those within the city for similar
service plus ten per cent, and that all such work be constructed
under the direction of the City Engineer and to the approval of
the Director of Public Service.

We would also recommend that the City Solicitor be
instructed to prepare a general ordinance regulating the
construction and extension of all water lines outside of the
