Gentlemen: We, the undersigned, owners of the number of feet of property set opposite our names below, the same being a majority of the foot frontage on Forest Avenue in the City of Alliance, Ohio, between the south line of Cedar Street and the north line of lots No 3496, and No 3499, if extended across said street, hereby respectfully petition your honorable body to pass the necessary legislation therefor, to grade and construct proper sewerage, between said termini, and that so much of the entire cost and expense thereof, less one fiftieth and the cost of intersections, if any, as may be assessed upon the adjacent, contiguous or other specially benefited lots and lands be assessed in proportion to the foot front as set out in what is known as the Hayland case 50.05, 471, of the lots and lands bounding and abutting on said portion of said street between the points aforesaid, said assessment to be paid in five annual installments or in cash at the option of the owner of the property assessed, in the manner provided by law for the levy and collection of assessments; and we each for him and herself, do hereby specifically waive the limitation provided for by Sections 3819 and 3827 of the General Code it being expressly understood and agreed by your petitioners that said grading and sewerage, heretofore provided for is not to be understood as an improvement of said portion of Forest Avenue but that such work shall be regarded and held to be only done as prior to a future improvement of said street.

The following petition was presented to council
 Petition by Owners of Three-fourth interest
 To the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio
 The undersigned, being the owners
 of the number of feet of property set opposite
 your names below, and being three-
 fourths or more in interest of the
 owners of property abutting upon S. Freedom
 Avenue between State Street and College
 Street, respectfully petition your Honorable
 board for the improvement of said street
 between the points aforesaid by grading
 and the entire cost of said improvement,
 except only such portion thereof as is
 by law chargeable against the
 municipality be assessed in proportion
 to the benefits that will result from
 said improvement, upon the lots and
 lands bounding and abutting upon
 said S. Freedom Avenue, between State
 and College Street.

And the undersigned and each of
 them consent and request that said
 assessments be levied and collected
 without reference to the value of
 the property of subscribers hereto
 and waive all benefits of the
 statute limiting assessments to $33\frac{1}{3}$
 per cent of the actual value of
 property assessed. Said assessments
 to be payable in six semi-annual
 installments proportioned to the
 whole assessment, or in cash at
 the option of the owner of property
 assessed, in the manner provided
 by law for the levy and collection
 of assessments.
