To the Honorable Council of the
City of Alliance, Ohio
Gentlemen.

Sometimes ago your honorable body appointed a committee to appraise the value of Lot No 4009, located on the west side of Liberty Avenue, north of Waugh Street, and that committee placed the value of \$500.00 upon said lot for the purpose of assessing the improvement of Liberty Avenue by paving

As there has been two similar improvements within the last five years, namely the improvement by grading and a second improvement by sewerage in front of said lot this would make a third improvement by paving. Section No 38.9 of the General Code of the State of Ohio provide that no assessments for any and all purposes within a period of five years shall exceed $33\frac{1}{3}$ per cent of the actual value of said premises.

Therefore we would respectfully petition your honorable body that you pass the necessary legislation to authorize the City Auditor and Clerk of Council to reduce said total assessments on said Lot No 4009 so that all three assessments shall not exceed $33\frac{1}{3}$ per cent of the value placed upon it by your honorable Committee.

Feb. 25th 1913 -

To the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio.
We, the undersigned, owners of the number of feet of property set opposite our names below, the same being a majority of the foot frontage on Woodland Avenue between Cleveland Street and Waugh Street, hereby respectfully petition your honorable board to pass the necessary legislation therefore and to improve said street between the points aforesaid by grading, and that so much of the entire cost and extra expense thereof as may be lawfully assessed upon the adjacent contiguous or other specially benefited lots and lands, be assessed by the foot front upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting on said Woodland Avenue between the points aforesaid, said assessments to be paid in five annual installments or in cash, at the option of the owner of property assessed, in the manner provided by law for the levy and collection of assessments.
