Gentlemen,

In 1905 the City of Alliance united the
Reservoir and Gamborn runs by means of
a closed sewer on Wester Ave. The
represent Mr Michael Ryan, who owns a
property fronting on Freedom St. but
whose property extends along the bank
of the Gamborn Run.

The Gamborn
is an open Run or water course along
Ryan's premises and by action of the
Council in discharging the waters
of the Reservoir Run into the Gamborn
Run it increases the flow so that
it damages the property in that way.

but more especially pollutes the stream and obnoxious and offensive smells arise making the habitation of his house almost unendurable and seriously damaging his premises.

Something must be done to relieve the situation and before we proceed with it we thought best to advise you so that if you desired a conference at any time we would be pleased to meet a committee that you might name, or the Council and see what can be done to remedy the present situation.
