 Gentlemen -

Some time ago your Honorable Body  
 passed legislation for the grading of  
 Mill Street between Cherry Ave and  
 Arch Avenue, in the City of Alliance, Ohio  
 but the said improvement has never  
 been completed and the undersigned,  
 while in conversation with your  
 Sewer District was informed of the

fact that there is not sufficient dirt on said street to fill same to the proposed grade. Just west of Oak Avenue, said Mill Street is not filled except possibly the width of the side walk, and there remains approximately 15 to 17 feet of a hole for the entire width of said street.

The undersigned is the owner of Lot #5814, 4985, 5815, 4946 abutting on said improvement and therefore respectfully request your Honorable Body to either complete said improvement or remit the assessments levied against these lots, as said improvement is of absolutely no benefit whatever to said premises.

For your further information, we might say that said premises referred to above abut upon the unfilled portion of said street. Trusting you will take immediate action on this matter, we beg to remain,
