Communications from the Director of Public Service.

Alliance, O

The Honorable City Council,
Alliance, Ohio.

Gentlemen:-

In the matter of making fill on the lands of Col. Morgan in connection with the improvement of the Rockhill Road as referred to the Director of Public Service, City Solicitor, and City Engineer, by resolution of Council, I would advise that the City Solicitor has declined to take any part in the adjustment of the matter and stated that it lies wholly within the duties of the Director of Public Service.

Accordingly we have had the City Engineer prepare plans showing the extent of this fill on the lands of Mr. Morgan and the extension of culvert necessary to take care of same, also the location of the fence, roadway and bridge that had been constructed by Mr. Morgan, a part of which is on the Public Street. This plan also showed the proposed change in that part of the Driveway which had been constructed by Mr. Morgan which would be affected by making this fill in accordance with the plans adopted by council for making this improvement. This plan was submitted to Mr. Morgan's attorney with the statement that on the part of the city we would agree, as incidental to and necessary in the carrying out of this improvement, to remove the fence erected on the street and restore that part of the driveway covered by the fill on his ground in the manner shown on the plan, thus leaving it as nearly as is practical in as good condition as it now exists, on further request from him that a barricade be provided to protect the fill we agreed that the city would replace the fence on the property line when the fill was completed, also seed the slope of bank to grass and protecting coat of rye or oats which the contractor agreed to do. We also agreed to make an effort to secure from the County Commissioners the extension of culvert necessary to complete this fill. We are advised by his attorney that Mr. Morgan agrees to accept these terms and permit the fill to be made on his land but desires to have the approval of Council for the things to be done by the City.

The City Engineer has prepared a plan and estimate for the extension of culvert to be made by the County and we have taken the matter up with the County Commissioners and surveyor and we believe they will take care of same.

We would estimate the City's portion of the cost of the additional work involved in the changes mentioned herein at \$150.00 over the regular contract price of the improvement, exclusive of the cost of culvert extension which properly belongs to the County. If your body desires to pass upon this matter as requested by Mr. Morgan we would be glad to have you do so at the earliest possible date.
