Mr. Voss. To issue bonds in the sum of Fifty thousand (\$50,000.00) dollars, for the purpose of purchasing or requiring real estate in the city of Alliance, State of Ohio and erecting thereon a city hospital.

Mr Voss. To provide for the selection of a site, by purchase, appropriation or otherwise upon which to erect a city hospital.

Voss moved, seconded by Barnard, that the Engineer be instructed to deliver plans for crossings at Sincia Avenue and South Street over the right of way of the G.C. & W. R.R. to the solicitor by Nov 24th and report his action to council at next meeting.

Which motion was agreed to.

Farmer moved, seconded by Barnard, that the solicitor be instructed to prepare an ordinance for the construction of a storm sewer on Ryans run in accordance with plans and estimate prepared by the engineer, said ordinance to provide that 50% of the cost be paid by the city and 50% by the abutting property.

Which motion was agreed to.

On motion of Lower, seconded by Yarnum, council adjourned, at 8:45 PM.
