They have also assessed me for this improvement in the sum of Two hundred and Thirty (\$230.00) to all of which I have protested.

I would kindly ask your Honorable Body to appoint a Committee to adjust this matter with me and compensate me for the damage done to my property as the same is practically worthless at this time.

Mr Barnard. To grant leave to M. Welch to lay a switch across what is known as Carr Alley, between Freedom and Seneca Avenues in the City of Alliance, at grade, from what is known as the Morgan Switch of the G. S. M. & A. Ry. was read the third time.

The question being on the passage of the ordinance. The yeas and Nays were taken and resulted Yeas 0 Nays 5.

Those who voted in the negative were Messrs Barnard, Farmer, Gubb, Voss, Yarnum

So the ordinance not having received the necessary majority vote was lost.

Res. No. 1668.

Be it resolved, by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, Section 1, That the Official Board of the Union Avenue M. E. Church is hereby granted the right to construct upon South Union Avenue in this city at points to be designated in front of said Union Avenue Church, by said Official Board, two three lamp posts, to be fully equipped ready for electric lighting, and free of all costs and expense to the city of Alliance, Ohio and upon said Official Board so doing, the City of Alliance

the City of Alliance, will furnish and supply electric current for such lamp, not to exceed 100 watts lamp. The same as if said lamp had been erected by the public, and free of all cost and expense to Union Avenue M.E. Church. was read the third time.

Mr. Yarnsey. To authorize the Director of Public Service of the City of Alliance, Ohio to enter into a contract for lighting the street, alley, avenue, public ground and public buildings of said city. was read the third time.

The question being on the passage of the ordinance. The yeas and Nays were taken and resulted Yeas 6 Nays 0.

Tanner moved, seconded by Yarnsey that Ord. No. 1683, be laid on the table.

Which motion was agreed to.

Ord. No. 1670

Mr. Yarnsey. An ordinance to levy special assessments for the improvement for a Sanitary sewer from a point at the center of the intersection of West Main Street in the City of Alliance, Ohio and Rockhill Road to and connect with Sewer No. 5 at a point on Vine Street and the center of the first alley east of Lincoln Ave. by consolidating Sewer 138. was read the third time.

Report of Standing Committee continued. The com. on Finance submitted Ord. No. 1686, and recommended passage. The committee on Streets and Alleys submitted Ordinance No 1687. and recommended passage.
