Gentlemen -

Referring to Ordinance No. 1688 which you have under consideration at the present time, involving an arrangement with the Alliance City Hospital Association whereby they are to transfer to the city for a nominal consideration, certain lots which they now own, the city to build thereon a City Hospital and then to lease the same to the Association for a term of years, beg to advise that it is our further understanding that the Association is to so change its Constitution and By-laws as to provide for the election of the Mayor and the Councilman of the City of Alliance as Trustees of the Association. There are now fifteen members on the Board of Trustees and this arrangement would therefore permit the city, indirectly through its officials, to have the majority representations on the board.
