Alhambra, O. Dec. 4<sup>th</sup> 1913

To the Council of the City of Alhambra, O.

Alhambra, O.  
Gentlemen.

As certain changes are being made in the Public Square, eliminating to a large extent the market feature and beautifying the grounds - and inasmuch as the Business Men's Association at one time sanctioned this change by a committee before the Council and at that time proffered our assistance in funding other facilities or grounds to take the place of same, we now wish to call the attention of this Council to the fact that there is at the present time one or more larger pieces of ground near the central part of the city, and now on the market, and suitable for public use, than has been available heretofore during the past twenty-five (25) years.

The advantages of having a place for butchering, for special marketing, for political or other gathering and especially now for transferring electric passengers and leaving for their comfort and safety is too apparent to need argument.

We have only to glance at our neighboring cities of Canton and Cleveland to see that those towns become great electric centers which have such facilities.

We ask that for the benefit of the merchant and their customers and for the electric growth of our city you investigate through your proper committee and make such provision in this line as you may be able to do.
