The council met in ~~an~~^{regular} session with President Reeves in the chair.

The roll being called the following members answered to their names.

A communication was received from the Director of Public Service relating to certain matters concerning his department. Barnard moved, seconded by Heidman that the communication be referred to the Finance Committee. Director of Public Service and City Solicitor.

Barnard moved, seconded by Guib that the City Solicitor be requested to prepare a resolution to issue a certificate of indebtedness to borrow money for the water department.

The following petition was presented to council.

Alliance O Feb. 11th 1914.

To the Honorable Council of the City of Alliance
State of Ohio.

We, the undersigned, owners of the number of feet of property set opposite our names below, the same being a majority of the foot frontage on East Broadway Street, between the East line of the right-of-way of the Cleveland & Pittsburgh Railroad, and the center line of Mahoning Avenue, hereby respectfully petition your Honorable board to pass the necessary legislation therefor and to improve said street between the points aforesaid, by paving, including all things incident thereto, and that so much of the entire cost and expense thereof as may be lawfully assessed upon the adjacent, contiguous or other specially benefited lots and lands be assessed by one of the legal methods of assessment upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said East Broadway Street between the points aforesaid, said assessment to be paid in not more than ten annual installments, or in cash at the option of the owner of property assessed in the manner provided by law for the levy and collection of assessments.

Knowles moved, seconded by Bunnard that the City Eng. be instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of East Broadway Street, between the east line of the right of way of the Cleveland, Pittsburgh Railroad, and the center line of Mahoning Avenue. ~~whereby~~ motion was agreed to.

The following petition was presented to council.

To the City Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio
Gentlemen.

We, the undersigned property owners on North Liberty Avenue, Alliance Ohio hereby protest to your Honorable body against the proposed paving of this Avenue. The reasons for this protest are:

First - We do not feel that the class and value of the properties on this street will justify the heavy expenditures, which will be assessed against these properties for this proposed improvement.

Second - We do not feel that there is any urgent demand for the improvement at this time, since the main north thorough-fare, known as Webb Avenue - is now paved and is but one block away from this Avenue and readily available for all ordinary teaming purposes.

Third - We do not feel that there is sufficient demand for this improvement from the property owners themselves on this thorough-fare.

For these reasons and numerous other ones which could be advanced we most vigorously protest against further legislation at this time looking toward this improvement. Consideration at your hands will be appreciated.
