A change of an established grade of 3.8 feet at State Street, which lapses out to nothing Six hundred feet further North.

Said South Liberty Avenue has already been graded, and filled along said proposed improvement to an average depth of about eight feet.

The owners claim that said property will be damaged in the sum of Two thousand \$2,000.00 by the proposed improvement on South Liberty Avenue under the resolution passed thereon on the 9th day of February 1914.
