

Mr. Miller:

An ordinance regulating the operation of Dry Cleaning and Pressing establishments, requiring a license therefore, and a bond for non-residence, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful from and after the first day of September 1, 1932. for any person, firm or corporation to engage in the business of dry-cleaning or pressing of clothing, wearing apparel, or household furnishings, or to solicit any such business in the City of Alliance, Ohio, without first applying to the Mayor of the City of Alliance for a license so to do, which application shall state the name under which said business is operated, and the names of the officers or individuals conducting the same, together with the place of business and the location of the establishment at which the work is actually carried on. The fee for such license to be the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per annum, or for any part thereof, obtainable on or before the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January and expiring at midnight on December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year.

Section 2. In all instances where it appears from the application that the establishment where such work is carried on is not located in the City of Alliance and goods or merchandise are to be taken outside of the townships of Washington and Lexington in Stark County, Knox Township in Columbiana County and Smith Township in Mahoning County, it shall be necessary for such applicants before a license may be issued to deposit with the Mayor of the City of Alliance, Ohio a cash bond in the sum of not less than Fifteen Hundred (\$1500.00) Dollars, conditioned that such applicants, other persons, firm or corporation shall well and truly account for any and all property removed from the City of Alliance, Ohio, for cleaning and pressing purposes, and in the case of loss or destruction thru any means whatever, including the acts of such applicant, or his or its agents and shall indemnify the owners of such property for the value thereof. And said bond shall further provide that in any action brought thereon, the venue of such action may be in Stark County, Ohio and that in case of

any such suit or action for a recovery under the terms thereof, service of such process at the office of the Mayor of the City of Alliance, shall be good and sufficient service upon the principal and sureties of such bond.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a mis-demeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period not to exceed thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

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or distinguishing marks upon such containers, tanks, pumps, or storage equipment; and to provide a penalty for violation of this ordinance.

Be it ordained by the council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio: SECTION 1. Liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products; deceit in sale unlawful. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation to store, sell, expose for sale or offer for sale any liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products in any manner whatsoever, so as to deceive or tend to deceive the purchaser as to the nature, quality and/or identity of the product so sold or offered for sale.

SECTION 2. Same; storage equipment to bear manufacturer's or distributor's distinguishing mark. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation to store, keep, expose for sale, offer for sale, or sell from any tank or container or from any pump or other distributing device any liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products other than those indicated by the name, trade name, trade name symbol, sign or other distinguishing mark or device of the manufacturer or distributor appearing upon the tank, container, pump or other equipment from which the same are sold, offered for sale or delivered.

SECTION 3. Same; disguise of equipment unlawful. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation to imitate the design, symbol, emblem, color scheme, trade name or markings of any equipment used, marketed or petroleum products, except with the written consent of such marketer, where such imitation tends to deceive or has the effect of deceiving the purchaser as to the nature, source, quality and/or identity of the product sold or offered for sale by the owner or operator thereof.

SECTION 4. Same; substitution, mixture or adulteration unlawful. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation to expose for sale, offer for sale or sell under any trademark or trade name in general use any liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products except those manufactured or distributed by the manufacturer or distributor marketing liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products, under such trade mark or trade name, or to substitute, mix or adulterate the liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products sold or offered for sale under such trade mark or trade name.

SECTION 5. Same; unlawful deposit in storage equipment. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation to aid or assist any other person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation in the violation of the provisions of this act by depositing or delivering into any tank, receptacle or other container any liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or petroleum products other than those of the person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation whose products are intended to be stored therein and sold therefrom as indicated by the trade mark, trade name, color scheme or emblem displayed on the container itself or on the pump or other storage device used in connection therewith.

SECTION 6. Same; labeling of storage equipment. There shall be firmly and securely attached to or painted on containers, tanks, pumps, or other storage equipment at or near the point from which liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products are drawn or removed for sale or delivery, a sign or label consisting of the word or words in letters not less than one inch in height comprising the brand or trade name of such liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products, and if any such liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products shall have no brand or trade name the sign or label shall consist of the words, in letters not less than three inches high, "Gasoline, No Brand," or "Lubricating Oil, No Brand," or words of similar meaning in the case of other products. The provisions of this section shall not apply to measuring cans, bottles, buckets, greasing devices or implements customarily used for conveying liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products from the containers in which such products are stored into vehicles to be serviced provided there be prominently displayed upon the rack, cabinet or frame on or in which such measuring cans, buckets or implements are customarily placed, hung or kept when not in use, a sign or label in the manner herein provided.

SECTION 7. Same; limitation of application for provisions of this ordinance. The provisions of this ordinance shall be construed to apply only to storage equipment at places where liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases or other petroleum products are sold or offered for sale at retail to the consumers or users thereof and shall not be construed to apply to places where such products are warehoused or stored for wholesale distribution nor to transportation equipment engaged solely in transporting such products from warehouses or bulk storage to retail places unless retail sales shall be made from such equipment, warehouses or bulk storage.

SECTION 8. Same; aiding or abetting substitution or adulteration of petroleum products. Whoever aids, abets or procures another to violate any of the provisions of this ordinance may be prosecuted and punished as if he were the principal offender.

SECTION 9. Penalty. Any person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation, or any officer, agent or employee thereof, who shall violate any provision of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one year or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

SECTION 10. Same; independent sections. The sections of this ordinance, and each part of such sections, are hereby declared to be independent sections and parts of sections and the holding of any section or part thereof, or the application to any person or circumstances, to be invalid or ineffective shall not affect any other section or part thereof or the application of any section or part thereof to other persons or circumstances.

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ORDINANCE NO. 46-O

An ordinance to prohibit fraud and deceit in the sale of liquid fuels, lubricating oils, greases, or other petroleum products; to prohibit the sale of such products under false or fictitious names; to prohibit substitution, mixing or adulteration of such products so as to deceive the purchaser thereof as to their identity, nature and/or quality; to prohibit the use of containers, tanks, pumps or other equipment for the storage or sale of such products, other than those indicated by the name, device, sign

An ordinance amending ordinance 70-F and ordinance 88-B licensing and regulating the taxicab business and taxicab drivers in the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That Section 16 of Ordinance 88-B and Section 6 of Ordinance 70-F shall be amended to read as follows:

Each taxicab operating in the City of Alliance, Ohio, on a per mileage basis shall be equipped with a meter, same to be tested and sealed by the scales of weights and measures. The meter rate shall not exceed thirty cents (30) for the first half mile, ten cents (10) for each additional one-fourth mile, and twenty-five (25) for each additional passenger for the entire trip. All trips to be made by the most direct route, and shall keep in full view in said taxicab a card or other notice indicating the rate charged.

Any duly licensed taxicab in said City of Alliance shall have the right to operate said taxicab without a meter on a flat city charge, which flat charge shall be duly printed on a card or notice, and shall be kept in full view in all of said taxicabs and shall in no event be more than fifty cents (50) for each person carried between any two points within the city limits of Alliance, Ohio. or any duly licensed taxicab operator shall also have the right to establish suburban rates from points in Alliance to points lying outside the City of Alliance, which rates shall be duly printed on a card or notice and kept in full view in said taxicab.

Section 2. All sections heretofore passed contrary to this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
