Referred to the com on Streets, Alleys, and City Solicitor.

Mr. Gubb, Chairman of the committee on Parks and Playgrounds, reported progress.

On motion of Patton, seconded by Ryan that the council visit the old settling basin water works ground. Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock.

President Steeves submitted communication on Parks and Playgrounds, which was referred to the committee of the whole.

Mr. Oberman addressed council on the subject of a lot at the rear of Mechanic that was being built on, and damaging his property, which had been previously referred to the committee on Streets and Alleys.

The City Solicitor called the attention of council to the street assessment cases that were pending in court, and stated that a settlement could be effected. And asked for instructions.

Knowles moved, seconded by Gubb that the City Solicitor be instructed to settle on a basis of ~~between~~ 55% - and 75% of the old part. And full payment of the parts of the street voided. Which motion was agreed to.

On motion of Knowles, Council refused back to the reports of the standing committees.
