

April 20th 1914

The council met in regular session with President Reeves in the chair.

The roll being called the following members answered to their names.

Messrs. Jarnard, Burkley, Gubb, Heidman, Knowles, Patton, Ryan Present 7. Absent 0.

Attorney Fisher called the attention of council to the will of Geo Snode which provide that \$500.00 be bequeath to the Trustee of the Alliance Cemetery. The interest of which shall be perpetually used for flowers to be placed at the grave of his deceased wife Sophia Snode and for the expenses of keeping said lot in proper condition. Attorney Fisher stated that the will would be contested in court. and asked that the city waive summons. by so doing the expense of services would be saved.

Heidman moved, seconded by Ryan that the City Solicitor be instructed to waive service of summons on the matter of Effie M. Miles Plaintiff vs. Jehiel M Snode executor of estate of George Snode et al.

Which motion was agreed to.

Mr. O. F. Algenfity called attention of the council to the improvement of East Broadway from Union Avenue to Arch Avenue. He asked if there was any way to get a sidewalk along the Junnerman lots. Citizens wants the street paved, but do not want to do that. and have no sidewalk on that portion of the street.

The Director of Public Service reported to council he was working upon the sewage disposal plant problem and hoped to have something to report very long.

Patton said the streets and alleys committee had visited a number of streets of the city recently Front Street was found in bad shape. Property owners have placed curbs upon private ground for walks and teams are using the curbs for driveways. It appeared to Mr Patton as if the grade had been changed. In places the sewer is above the street.

On motion of Patton, the above matter was refered to the engineer to report on a suitable grade.

B. Rickard called attention to place in Cambridge Street near Arch where he said the skull had been dug up by the Gas company and the street has settled.

On motion of Barnard the engineer was instructed to prepare plans for the improvement of South Linden Avenue.
