Gentlemen -

Owing to the fact that we are having some few cases of small pox we find that the appropriation made for the first half of the year in some of our funds is entirely exhausted and would ask your Honorable body to provide the following appropriation to ride us over until after July 1st 1914

Quarantine Medical Service \$50.00

" Food Supplies 75.00

" Medical " 25.00

" Incidentals 15.00

Sanitary Incidentals 10.00

Also the Board of Health passed the following resolution at its last regular meeting April 27th 1914: Resolved that Clerk be instructed to ask Council to pass a resolution appropriating \$500.00 to be at the disposal of the board for the purpose of abating nuisances by connecting outside closets with sanitary sewers after owners have been properly notified to connect and remove outside closets within a reasonable time and they fail to comply

and the cost of same be assessed against the owners of the property.

The following petition was presented to Council.

Petition by owners of Three Fourth in interest

To the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio
We, the undersigned, being the owners of the number of feet of property set opposite our names below, and being three-fourth or more in interest of the owner of property abutting upon South Seneca street between the south line of East Summit and the north line of East Walnut Street respectfully petition your honorable Board for the improvement of said street between said points aforesaid by grading, draining and paving with brick block and that the entire cost of said improvement, except only such portion thereof as is by law, chargeable against the municipality, be assessed by the foot front upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said South Seneca street between the points aforesaid.

And the undersigned and each of them consent and request that said assessment be levied and collected without reference to the value of the property of subscribers hereto and waive all benefits of the statute limiting assessments to 33 1/3 per cent of the actual value of the property assessed; said assessments to be payable in 10 semi-annual installments proportioned to the whole assessment, or in cash, at the option of the owner of property assessed in the manner provided by law for the levy and collection of assessments.
