Alliance, O.

Gentlemen:

Referring to my communication of May 14<sup>th</sup>, in regard to the site for swimming pool, I have investigated more thoroughly the site at the old settling basin and have the following report to offer.

There is some leakage in the settling basin but as long as there is water in the dam this could be supplied to the basin thru the race. It would also make a more desirable pool to have a fresh supply run in from the dam when needed.

I see no objections to using the water from the dam only when the city supply is low. The settling basin could be put in shape for a pool in about two weeks. This provides a pool for use this summer.

The report of the committee was accepted.

The following petition was presented to council.

We, the undersigned citizens and Manufacturers in the first and second ward and territory adjacent thereto, respectfully petition the Honorable Council of the City of Alliance to enact legislation necessary for the erection on the Park Street property belonging to the city, a building suitable for installing and maintaining the horses and horse drawn equipment now at No 2 Fire Station.

To impress upon you the necessity of this petition would state the following facts.

First. The territory below the Pittsburgh and Ft. Wayne railroad tracks which is without a fire station is equal to the area above the Pittsburgh and Ft. Wayne tracks which has three fire stations.

Second. Eighty per cent of the streets in this territory are not paved.

Third. Ten of the industries of the city, employing over two thousand people, are located in this territory.

Fourth. Investment to provide the protection, approximately three to five thousand dollars is small in comparison with the loss to the city if one of the above manufactures sustained a fire.

Signed by approximately 300 citizens.

Mr Barnard. Declaring it necessary to improve Alley South of Milner Street between Arch Avenue and Linden Avenue. by grading, draining, curbing and paving with brick block. was read the first time.

Res No 1761.

Mr Barnard. Declaring it necessary to improve Eleventh Street between Union Avenue and Arch Ave. and between Linden Ave. and Freedom Ave. by grading, draining and curbing and paving with brick block. was read the first time.

Ord No 1771

Mr Barnard. To amend paragraph 2 Section 1 of ordinance number 1339 of the City of Alliance Ohio. entitled. An ordinance to fix the number, bond, and salary of the number of the Fire Department of the City of Alliance Ohio was read the first time.

Barnard submitted a plat of the replat of Lots 2188 and 2187

Ord No. 1770

Mr Hudman. An ordinance to make supplementary appropriation to the regular semi-annual appropriation ordinance. was read the first time.

Ord No. 1762

Mr Knowles. An ordinance regulating operation of Motor Cycle upon the streets, alleys, avenues, and public places in the City of Alliance Ohio. was read the first time. Referred to Judiciary

Ord No. 1767

Mr Ryan. An ordinance to establish a grade on Crescent Boulevard from Rockhill Avenue to Cullinan Avenue. was read the first time. Referred to Streets, Alleys.

Ord No. 1768

Mr Ryan. To vacate Cullinan Street, from the south line of Vincent Street, to the north line of Simpson Street. was read the first time.

Ord No. 1766

Mr Ryan. To issue bonds for the purpose of paying the City's portion of the improvement of Mechanic Street, West Street, Second Street, Warehouse Street, Seneca Street, East Broadway Street, and Rush Street was read the first time.

Ord No. 1765

Mr Gubb. Declaring it necessary to improve South Seneca Avenue between South line Summit Street and North line of Milner Street by grading, draining, curbing and paving with brick block was read the first time.

Declaring it necessary to improve Ryan Run from south line of Freedom Avenue to Alley South of Ely Street by constructing a storm sewer and to make provisions for the same was read the first time.

The yeas and Nays were taken, and resulted yeas 6. Nays 0.

Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Barnard, Binkley, Gubb, Widman, Knowles, Ryan.

So the rule was suspended, and the ordinance read the second and third time.

The question being on the passage of the ordinance the yeas and Nays were taken and resulted yeas 6.

Nays 0. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Barnard, Binkley, Gubb, Widman, Knowles, Ryan.

So the ordinance was passed. Ryan called attention to a small tract of land on Mechanics between Ely and Hester that the city owned and ought to secure for a small park.
