

Mr. Clark:

An ordinance to regulate ^{and} license within the City of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio, the business of photography, including both resident ^{and} transient photographers.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:-

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to conduct the business of photography in the City of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio, without having first procured a license from the Mayor of the City of Alliance as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. The license fee for any resident person, firm or corporation conducting the business of photography in the City of Alliance, shall be \$5.00 per year or any part of a year, payable on the second day of January of each ^{and} every year.

Section 3. A transient photographer, for the purpose of this ordinance is hereby defined as any itinerant photographer, picture ^{and} view taker, coupon salesman, enlargement solicitor or canvassers therefore, all in conformity with the definition and law relating to itinerant vendors, included within Sec. 6347 to 6369 Inc. of the General Code of Ohio.

Section 4. No person, firm or corporation shall engage in, or follow the business or occupation of an itinerant photographer as hereinbefore defined, within the City of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio, without having first obtained a license therefor from the Mayor of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Section 5. The license fee for any itinerant person, firm or corporation carrying on the business of photography in the City of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio, shall pay \$10.00 a day for each and every person engaged in such business.

Section 6. Whenever any person, firm or corporation shall claim that he or it intends to become a permanent photographer in said City and who would otherwise be classified as an itinerant photographer, said person, firm or corporation shall then comply with all the terms and provisions of Ordinance - 86-3, passed by the City of Alliance, on August 4, 1924, and known as the "Itinerant Vendors License Ordinance".

Section 7. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the terms of this ordinance shall be considered guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00 or by incarceration in the workhouse for not more than three months or both.

Section 8. The declaration of any portion

of the aforesaid ordinance as unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, shall not in any way invalidate the balance of said ordinance not so declared illegal, invalid and unconstitutional, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed by the passing of this ordinance which in no way repeals, alters or changes the terms of # 86-G of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Section 9. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 13-P

Mr. Clark:
An ordinance to regulate and license within the city of Alliance, Stark county, Ohio, the business of photography, including both resident and transient photographers.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Alliance, state of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to conduct the business of photography in the city of Alliance Stark county, Ohio, without having first procured a license from the mayor of the city of Alliance as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2. The license fee for any resident person, firm or corporation conducting the business of photography in the city of Alliance shall be \$5.00 per year or any part of a year, payable on the second day of January of each and every year.

SECTION 3. A transient photographer, for the purpose of this ordinance is hereby defined as any itinerant photographer, picture and view taker, coupon salesman, enlargement solicitor or canvassers therefore, all in conformity with the definition and law relating to itinerant vendors, included within Sec. 6347 to 6369 inc., of the General Code of Ohio.

SECTION 4. No person, firm or corporation shall engage in, or follow the business or occupation of an itinerant photographer as hereinbefore defined, within the city of Alliance Stark county, Ohio, without having first obtained a license therefor from the mayor of the city of Alliance, Ohio.

SECTION 5. The license fee for any itinerant person, firm or corporation carrying on the business of photography in the city of Alliance, Stark county, Ohio, shall pay \$10.00 a day for each and every person engaged in such business.

SECTION 6. Whenever any person, firm or corporation shall claim that he or it intends to become a permanent photographer in said city, and who would otherwise be classified as an itinerant photographer, said person, firm or corporation shall then comply with all the terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 86-G, passed by the city of Alliance, on August 4th, 1924, and known as the "Itinerant Vendors License Ordinance."

SECTION 7. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the terms of this ordinance shall be considered guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00 or by incarceration in the workhouse for not more than three months or both.

SECTION 8. The declaration of any portion of the aforesaid ordinance as unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, shall not in any way invalidate the balance of said ordinance not so declared illegal, invalid and unconstitutional, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed by the passing of this ordinance which in no way repeals, alters or changes the terms of No. 86-G of the city of Alliance, Ohio.

SECTION 9. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
