

- Monday Aug 17th 1914 -

The council met in regular session with President Steves in the chair.

The roll being called the following members answered to their names. Messrs. Barnard, Binkley, Gubb, Heidman, Knowles, Ryan.
Present 6. Absent 1.

The minutes of the previous were read and approved.

The City Solicitor called attention to the decision of Judge Day in the corner lot cases, and stated that the city was without an legal assessment on corner lots and council should pass a reassessment ordinance on said corner lots.

On motion of Knowles, seconded by Binkley the corner lot matter ~~be~~ was referred to the committee of the whole.

The City Solicitor submitted a journal entry in the corner lot cases, which he desired council to approve.

On motion of Heidman, seconded by Knowles, the journal entry was approved.

Knowles moved, seconded by Gubb, that the time for paying the assessments in the repaving cases be extended to Sept 15th 1914.

The Water committee to whom was referred the petition for extension of water service outside city limits from West Main street extending west of Rockhill Avenue a distance of about 550 feet, submitted the following report.
