Dear sir,

In answer to your request of September 24th, in regard to three cornered lot bounded by West, Ely and Mechanic Streets referred back to you by Council, will say that the estimated assessment on said lot is Three hundred and Eighty one - and 09/100 (\$381.09) Dollars. The size of the lot cannot be given you at this time on account of the fact that the P.R. Company's map shows track Right-of-way across this lot but does not show if the P.R. Company owns the Right-of-way through same. It will be necessary for me to look up the records on this. The lot is approximately 50 x 99 1/2 x 100 x 30 west of tracks and the three cornered piece east of the tracks is 35 x 30 x 25.
