The Town Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance met at the brick school house in free by a call, by the Mayor, and organized by the Mayor taking the chair, Council all present, A petition was presented by J. N. Webb for ~~the vacating of a road that part of a~~ ~~small County road running through the North East Quarter of Section No. 25 in Lexington Township and within the limits of said Incorporation, There was also a remonstrance presented against same road. The advantages and disadvantages were discussed and finally it was resolved, on motion Resolved That the above named road is declared vacated on its final passage it was voted yeas 4 nays 1. Yeas Messrs Hanger, Pierce Chapman Woodworth & Hoover Nays Messrs Webster, on motion resolved that the Recorder give an order on the Treasurer of the Incorporation to W. N. Lewis for five dollars and fifty eight cents for printing ordinances and handbills &c Passed, on motion resolved that the ~~Recorder~~ give an order on the Treasurer ~~for~~ ~~to~~ Hoover for eight dollars for recording, carrying the Chain in surveying the Incorporation & meeting school board Passed, on motion Resolved that the recorder give an order on the Treasurer ~~for~~ ~~to~~ Pierce of two dollars for taking Enumeration in the Incorporation school district Passed, on motion we adjourn signed~~
