The Town Council of the incorporated village of Alliance met according to notice given by Mayor. All the Council present

A Resolution was presented by F. S. Pierce as follows:

Resolved by the Town Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance that the law requiring the reading of each ordinance on three different days be suspended, to pass an ordinance to regulate Public Shows which carried by a unanimous vote

On Motion the following Ordinance to Regulate Public Shows passed by a unanimous vote

to Regulate Public Shows

Sec 1st Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, That before any Exhibitor or Exhibitors of any travelling public Show not prohibited by the laws of this State, shall be allowed to exhibit or show any natural or artificial curiosity or exhibition of horsemanship, in a circus or otherwise, within the corporate limits of the town of Alliance, for any price, gain or reward, he, she, or they shall apply to the Mayor, or in his absence the Recorder for a permit; and it shall be the duty of the Mayor, or in his absence the Recorder, to give him, her or them a license or a permit, specifying the time he, she or they may be allowed to show or exhibit in the town, on the person or persons thus applying, paying into the treasury the amount which the said Mayor or Recorder may assess on him, her or them, for the privilege of exhibiting or showing such Show, which assessment, in no case, shall exceed Twenty five dollars nor be less than Two dollars, for each and every day during which said Show shall be exhibited.

Sec 2nd Be it further ordained by the authority aforesaid, that if any person or persons shall exhibit any public Show within the corporate limits of the village of Alliance, without first having obtained the permit, according to the provisions of this ordinance, he, she or they shall, for every such offense, pay a sum not to exceed fifty dollars, in the discretion of the Magistrate, having jurisdiction of the same, to be recovered in a civil action, at the suit of any citizen of the incorporated limits, and paid into the treasury of said incorporation.

Section 3rd This ordinance to take effect from and after the 7th day of July 1855.
