regard to the condition of the sick, and adopt  
such other measures as they in their wisdom  
deem proper

In Compliance

with your resolution, requesting me to report to your Body respecting the Milligan Family (Time Indefinite) I herewith make a statement such as is surmised you desire. There is one case of small pox in the family - the only one that I know of in Town - disease in the commencement of the declining stage, therefore in condition to be conveyed by persons visiting him more ready than heretofore, and increasingly so until the scabs all fall and are disposed of. None of the other children of the family (six or seven in number, were not until two days ago protected by vaccination, thus laying the others exceedingly liable to contract the disease.

Since my attendance upon the Invalid, means have been taken to render as little amenable to its ravages as possible and to protect the Publick, by keeping the family at Home - furnishing them with the necessaries of life by placing them within their reach and by a change of clothing after each visit &c. Herewith find Bill from Mr McLain for Articles used by family & authorised to be procured by the Mayor of this Village, which please assume the payment of. If the family are so rendered by the disease to which they are exposed their necessities will demand that a Nurse or Nurses be procured, that food fuel and probably on their recovery clothing furnished, this will be determined by or before the last of this present week in all probability. Furthermore to protect the Citizens & render the sick comfortable there will have to be means of conveying what is appropriated to them
