

Members present: Leek, Vincent, Gray, Loke, Strong, absent Ellison.

The Solicitor reported that no further action was necessary in regard to the elevations of Sidewalks, as the ordinances now on Record regulated the same.

However on motion of Vincent seconded by Strong the Solicitor was instructed to prepare amendments to the ordinance establishing Grades on Alliance Street & Mt Union Street so that the elevation of the sidewalks shall be one inch to every four feet of width of walk from the curbstones. Carried.

Strong reported that the Committee on Safe had purchased a safe for \$150⁰⁰ delivered on board of Cars at Alliance, of the Canton Safe Works, who agree, if required to take a village bond for the amount due in one year, with 8 per cent interest.

On motion of Leek seconded by Loke Report was accepted & action of Committee approved.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Gray passed to second Reading an ordinance to grade and improve Alliance Street between C. & P. R. R. & Ark Street.

Clerk read Letter from Mr Hallau in regard to old Building at Corner of Grant & Ark Streets.

Petition for a new Walk on South Side of Grant between Ark & Mt Union Streets was read and on motion referred to Sidewalk Committee.

Petition of Mrs. Lydia Jenkins in regard to their farm was read and on motion of Gray seconded by Vincent referred to

Solicitor for examination & written report.

Chairman of Gas Committee.

Sir. The Alliance Gas Light Company will furnish gas light and keep in repair the public Lamps for the sum of two dollars and fifty cents per month for each post or lamp and will light not less than an average of nineteen nights per month or two hundred and thirty nine nights during the year; and will agree to use eight feet burners, and keep said lamps burning "when there is no moon" until 12 o'clock; or to be more specific will not commence extinguishing any of the lamps until after 12 o'clock, and we will further agree to keep the lamps burning all night when there is no moon whenever there is any unusual gathering as on Fourth of July, Circus or Fairs, and to allow one or more lamps to be burned when repairing Streets or crossings without extra compensation. It is hoped that the Committee will see that we are offering one hour more light for

the same pay than we gave last year.
 Hoping that our past service has
 given satisfaction we will endeavor to
 meet your expectations during the coming
 year, provided we should be awarded
 the Contract.
