Council met pursuant to previous adjournment - Mayor Barnaby presiding council present were John A. Staub Isaac Miller & A. L. Jones

On Motion

of A. L. Jones the rule for reading ordinances on three separate evenings was suspended and the following ordinance was passed on the 10th & 3^d reading. Ballot as follows

An Ordinance prescribing the duties of the Board of Health

Sec 1st

Be it ordained by the town council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance that it shall be the duty of the Board of Health of said village when any person or family within the limits of said village shall have the Small pox varioloid cholera or other infectious or contagious disease whereby the health of the people of said village will be endangered by reason of their mingling with society in the ordinary employments of life or passing along the street of said village to cause all such persons family or families to be confined in a secure place so as to prevent them from mingling with society until they shall have been restored to health and if it is necessary to prevent any such disease from spreading the board of health shall close and shut up the house or houses of any such person family or families until the danger of spreading said disease shall cease

Sec 2^a

That it shall further be the duty of said board of health to provide after application made to them for that purpose some person or persons to wait upon and take care of all such families and also furnish all the necessaries for any such person or family and if they shall be unable to pay for the same then said Board shall furnish all waiting medical attendance and other services at the expense of said Incorporated village. But nothing in this ordinance shall be

constituted so as to prevent said Village from collecting the expenses of any such taking care Physicians bill or other necessaries if they ever become able to pay the same

Sec 3^d This ordinance to be in full force from and after its passage and publication

We the undersigned Nathan Ball & Elwood Lamborn Trustees of Smith Township Mahoning county State of Ohio met with A. L. Jones & Eli Grant two members of the council of the Incorporate Village of Alliance said Incorporate Village being an independent Road District of Lexington Township in Stark County and divided the new road laid out on the county line beginning at the street running east from Alliance Thence south to the old road on said county line and divided said new road as follows to wit Smith Township Mahoning county to work the part of said new road lying north of the P. & W. C. Rail way and said Alliance Road District to work that part south of said Rail Road in testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hand and seal this 10th day of May A. D. 1862

To his Honor the Mayor of Alliance Ohio
 The Board of health of said village at its special
 meeting this morning called in consequence of
 complaint being made of unprotected conta-
 gious disease appointed its physician to
 make the necessary investigation beg leave
 to make the following report-

That in the family of Mrs. Jesse Hampton are three
 cases of contagious disease in the commu-
 nent of the eruptive stage & therefore being
 in the readiest period of susceptibility of
 communication. Your Board would further
 report that they are favorably situated for
 confining the disease to the house in which
 it is at present located and all that is
 necessary to make every one secure not already
 exposed is to have no communication with
 the sick and attendants and those at large
 and we would further suggest that you and
 the council take immediate measures to
 protect our citizens by appointing their
 medical adviser or other person to see
 that your will is executed

And as a final suggestion we
 would call your attention to the propriety of
 at once passing an ordinance more ex-
 plicitly defining the duties of the Board
 of health and when these are made oblig-
 atory and responsibility and expenditure
 of time is involved there should be a
 remuneration
