

A Petition presented signed by H.C. Strong, D.A. R.R. to intersect a street (name unknown) running between the House known as the "Cataract" and one occupied by D.A. Musser, on motion of Mr. Buckman, was received & filed. —

Council met pursuant to adjournment Mayor Buckman presiding. Councilmen present. Messrs Barr, Buckman & Gillispie. — On motion of Barr, the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was deferred till after receiving the report of the Trustees of the Cemetery. A partial report of the Trustees of Cemetery was presented and on motion of Mr. Buckman it was resolved that further consideration of the report be extended until next meeting. —

Minutes of previous meeting read and adopted. Mr. Buckman reported that Mr. Altman had not been able to procure the money he was authorized to borrow for use of the borough. —

on motion, the Committee to investigate relative to the nuisance on North Liberty St. was extended until ^{next} meeting for report. —

on motion, the ^{mi} Committee appointed to examine the St. Com^r report, was extended till next meeting. —

on motion of Barr, the ^{Mayor} was authorized to appoint a ^{appointed} Committee on side walks. — where upon the Mayor, Gillispie, Buckman & Shimp on said Committee. —

A Bill in favor of Dr. Wilson — in sum of \$5⁰⁰/₁₀₀ — for services on Board of Health, for the year 1865 — was presented, and accepted, and order drawn on the Treasurer for same. —

J.B. Johnson reported that Mr. Hawkins did not do his duty as St. Commissioner. —

on motion the Council was appointed as a Committee to examine whether there was cause for complaint. — The Mayor & Recorder were authorized
