able in one year at 10 per cent interest, and applied the same  
in part payment of a Bond held by S. Stock & Son, also made  
arrangements for a further loan with said Johnston.

to wit: an Ordinance for working convicts on the streets  
an Ordinance to prohibit persons from congregating or  
loitering about the doors of business, dwelling or other  
houses, and an Ordinance for the Punishment of persons  
for Assault & Battery, and Breaching the Peace,  
Our Motion of J. Buckman, the rule requiring all  
ordinances to be read at three meetings of the Council  
before their final passage, was suspended, in order  
to put said Ordinances upon their final passage this evening  
The above mentioned Ordinances were then taken up  
and passed by the following vote,

The Ordinance for working convicts on the streets.

An ordinance to prohibit <sup>sec 1<sup>st</sup></sup> Be it ordained by the town Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, That if any person or persons, shall congregate about the doors of houses or loiter about the door or doors, of any business, dwelling, or other house, so as to hinder or annoy persons entering or departing therefrom, every person so offending shall upon conviction thereof, before the Mayor, be fined in any sum not exceeding two dollars, and pay the costs of prosecution.

sec 2<sup>d</sup> This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

An ordinance for the <sup>sec 1<sup>st</sup></sup> Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, That if any person or persons shall, with <sup>Violence & Breach of the</sup> Peace in the Incorporated Village of Alliance, unlawfully assault or threaten another, in a menacing manner, or shall unlawfully strike or wound another, the person or persons so offending shall, upon conviction thereof, before the Mayor, be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars, nor less than five dollars, or be kept at hard labor on the streets and highways, of said Village, or such other place as the Mayor shall designate, not more than ten days, or both at the discretion of the Mayor, and also pay the costs of prosecution.

sec 2<sup>d</sup> That if any person or persons, shall challenge another, or others, to fight at fisticuffs, or with cudgels, or shall provoke, or attempt to provoke another, or others, to commit a breach of the peace, within the corporate limits of the Village of Alliance, every such person or persons, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and on conviction thereof, before the Mayor, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding ten dollars, nor less than one dollar, and also pay the costs of prosecution.

sec 3<sup>d</sup> This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
