The Clerk was appointed to Notify Nipnot Co to attend the next meeting of Council, to explain their Bill for repairing Fire Engine, the Bill of ~~James~~ Crew & Binford, laid over at the meeting held Oct 13<sup>th</sup> was taken up and on Motion laid over until next regular Meeting.

Meprs Gillespie & East, presented a bill for chimney tops for Lockrap amount \$4<sup>00</sup> which on motion was laid over till next regular Meeting.

R. W. Buck, presented a bill for repairing sidewalks on north Liberty street amount \$34.49, which was accepted and an order drawn on the Treasury for the amount.

Garrison & Brother, presented a bill for Printing amount \$67.25, which on Motion was referred to Recorder for examination, to report to next meeting.

G. B. Johnson presented a bill, for Plank's joice hauling & repairing Bridge near Alliance Mills, amount \$35.87 which on Motion was rejected.

G. B. Johnson also presented a Bill for repairing Bridges and streets which was accepted and an order drawn on the Treasury for the amount \$68.50. Mr J. Buckman requesting to have his Vote recorded against the acceptance of said Bill.

Mr A. Patton, presented a Bill for digging Cistern amount \$20.<sup>00</sup> which on Motion was laid over till next meeting.

On Motion the Mayor, was appointed to correspond with Mr Hawkins Street Commissioner, to ascertain who have worked or paid their Road tax.

C. Davis, Marshal presented a Bill for arresting and subsisting George Reed on a charge of Drunkenness, which on Motion was accepted and an order drawn on the Treasury for the amount \$2.<sup>00</sup>.
