in part to petition and recommended the
laying of a walk on east side of North Mill Union
Street from Ely Street to Cemetery Street.

Moved by Vincent that the Report be accepted
& the walk ordered, seconded by Coates, when
Vincent moved to lay this motion on the table
until the next regular meeting, seconded by
Leek & carried.

The Committee further reported favorable to
petition for new walk on South Side of Market
Street between Arch & Park Streets. On motion

A Communication was received from Engine Co No 1 + Horse Co's No 1 + 2 recommending and asking the appointment of W. W. King as Chief

of Fire Department and L E Graham and O Harrington as Assistants.

A Petition was read, signed by Property owners and Residents for the opening of Liberty Street south to Corporation line, accompanied by a subscription amounting to \$2000 to defray expenses, if the work is done.

appreciated remarks, after which Mr Fording retired.

 administration as Mayor, seconded by Vincent - and carried
 to which Mr Fording responded,

On motion of Vincent - seconded by Beardley Passed
 to 1st Reading. An ordinance establishing a grade on
 Linden Avenue.

On motion of Gray seconded by Fokes passed to 1st Reading
 An ordinance establishing a grade on Arch Street.

On motion of Gray seconded by Coates, the Rules were
 suspended to permit these ordinances to pass their second
 and third readings and final passage, by the following vote
 Yeas 6 Yeas Beardley Gray Coates Fokes Vincent - 6 Nays 0

The ordinance establishing grade on Linden
 Avenue then passed second and third reading, and
 the vote on its final passage stood as before Yeas 6
 Nays 0. The Mayor declared the Ordinance passed.

The ordinance establishing a grade on Arch
 Street then passed second and third readings and the
 vote on its final passage also stood as before Yeas 6 Nays 0

The Mayor declared this ordinance passed.

On motion of Vincent - seconded by Fokes the
 Solicitor was instructed to prepare an Ordinance

 Monday eve May 21. 1877

Council convened in regular session
 Mayor Day presiding. Members present:

Leek, Beardley, Gray, Coates, Lokes, Vincent.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved

Street Committee reported favorable to
 petition asking for the improvement of
 Liberty Street, as it requires to be put in better
 condition to make it passable.

A Remonstrance signed by property owners
 against the putting down of a new sidewalk
 on south side of Market Street between
 Arch and Park was read and on motion of
 Gray seconded by Beardley referred to a
 Special Committee of Three, consisting of
 Leek Vincent and Gray.

On motion of Coates seconded by Gray
 a new walk was ordered on West Side of
 Linden Avenue between Alliance + Market
 Street.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Lokes
 the sidewalk Committee was instructed to
 investigate the matter of sidewalk at
 Lutheran Church lot.

On motion of Lokes seconded by Leek the
 Mayor was directed to notify Mrs Thos.
 Thomas to put down a new walk of proper
 width of brick or flagstone.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Gray
 the Mayor was further instructed to notify
 all persons to lay new walks, where the

Some are not now on the grade and of proper width on Alliance Street between Arch Street and R. R. Depot.

On motion of Coates seconded by Leek a new sidewalk was ordered on East Side of Walnut Street in Freedom in front of Hubbard lot & in front of old Brewery lot.

On motion of Leek seconded by Coates a new sidewalk was ordered on west side of Liberty Street in front of Carrington Shop.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Coates the matter of crossings on Alliance Street was referred to a joint Committee of the Sidewalk and Street Committee.

Leek stated that P. B. Garland, employed to lay sidewalk & crossings at \$1.50 per day, was unwilling to work any longer at that price, and he therefore moved that the town pay him \$1.75 per day, motion was seconded by Coates and after some expressions by the Members of Council, Vincent moved that the matter lay on the table until next meeting seconded by Leek and Carried.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Gray passed to 1st Reading, An Ordinance fixing the rate of taxation.

Moved by Vincent, that the Rules be suspended to permit this Ordinance to pass second and third Reading and final passage, motion seconded by Coates and carried as follows; Yeas: Leek, Beardley, Gray, Coates, Stokes, Vincent - 6. Nays - 0.

The Ordinance then passed to second and third reading and the vote on its final passage stood as before, Yeas: 6. Nays - 0.

The Mayor declared the Ordinance duly passed.

The Clerk read the names of 144 Citizens to serve as jurors in trials for the violation of the Ordinance.
