

asking that a side walk be put down, Commencing on the north side of Allen Street at S. Craig's corner and running thence North to Main Street in Alliance proper until it intersects the walk in front of the Union School House, said petitions received and walks ordered to be put down in accordance with the prayer of the petitions said walks to be six feet wide and of oak or pine lumber laid upon three stringers and well spiked together, and to be completed in four weeks

On Motion the Recorder was appointed a committee to look up the amount of side walks put down Rail Road Cos and individuals which are unpaid and report to next regular Meeting.

On Motion the Mayor & Recorder were instructed to execute a Bond for the sum of seven hundred dollars payable on the 20th day of February 1869 to Enos Ailes for money due him, as a loan made some two years since.

On Motion adjourned to meet at the call of the Mayor.

April 10th 1868

Council met at the call of Mayor Buck, and on examination of the Poll Books it was found that the following Officers were elected for the present year, for Mayor Isaac Ewan, Recorder Joseph Barnaby, Treasurer W. H. Seel, Marshal E. C. Brown, who in accordance with previous Notice were all present, and Councilman L. B. Davis, William Jones, J. W. Lyder J. K. Blackburn & R. P. Johnson who were also all present, and were duly sworn by Mayor Buck as required by Law to perform their several duties as such Officers.

W. H. Seel and E. C. Brown presented their Bonds, which were accepted and approved.

On Motion adjourned to meet tomorrow evening at 7 o'clock P. M.
