Monday evening June 11. 1877

Council convened in regular Session

Mayor Day presiding

Members Present Leek Beardsley Gray Coates
Vincent, absent Fikes

Minutes of last regular and adjourned Sessions read and approved

Special Committee on Remonstrance against a new walk on South side of Market Street between Arch and Park Street reported adversely in part only and Gray moved that a new walk be laid ~~from~~ the Residence of Mr. Crovans to the Bridge on West Street, seconded by Coates and lost.

On motion of Coates seconded by Gray new walks were ordered on east Side of lot belonging to Baptist Church, also on North Side of Market Street in front of property of Wm. Sikes and Joel Paris, also on west Side of Arch Street along lots of S. Doane and R. Thompson.

A Remonstrance was read signed by property owners and citizens against putting down new walk on East Side of Mt. Union Street between Ely and Cemetery Street. On motion of Vincent seconded by Beck it was accepted and placed on file.

A Communication was received of Brecken Mfg. Co. of Niles in regard to Street lamps and on motion of Vincent seconded by Beardsley referred to Gas Committee.

Vincent stated that he was informed that the right of way could be obtained with out expense for a Street from Ely Street to Cemetery Street and moved that the matter be referred to the Solicitor for investigation and report seconded by Beardsley and carried.

A Communication of R. Lamborn Fire Warden of Dist No 3 was read informing the Council of the dangerous condition of the Wallace Building on Arch Street.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Coates it was referred to Solicitor with instructions to take such legal steps as will be necessary in the case.

On motion of Gray seconded by Beardsley the Sidewalk Committee was instructed to

receives bids from responsible parties to put down sidewalks, as follows: 1st by the day 2^d by the foot with material furnished, and 3^d by the foot material not furnished.

Report of 'St. St. King Chief of Fire Department for the disbandment of the Fire Police was read and on motion of Gray seconded by Beardley accepted, placed on file and the Police Company disbanded.

The Chief was also instructed to proceed at once to call in all uniforms and then organize a new Fire Police in accordance with Ordinance.

Report of P. B. Carlisle of lumber, spikes and tool account was read and on motion of Coates seconded by Seck accepted and placed on file.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Beardley passed to 1st Reading "An Ordinance to levy and assess a special tax on Alliance Street between the C. & P. R. R. and Arch Street.

Vincent moved that the day on which assessments shall be paid shall be July 14. 1877 and that the same be inserted in the Ordinance seconded by Beardley & Carried.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Coates the Rules were suspended to permit the passing of the Ordinance on its second and third Reading and final Passage by the following vote; Yeas: Seck, Beardley, Gray, Coates, Vincent - 5. Nays: - 0.

The Ordinance then passed second and third Reading and the vote on the final passage stood again as before; Yeas: - 5 Nays: - 0
