The following side walks were ordered to be put down within fifteen days from this date. to wit:

Also, on the north side of Rail Road Street, Commencing at Philip's Store corner thence east to the C. & P. Rail Road.

Also on the south side of Columbia Street, Commencing at the east line of Lot No 72, and running west to Depot Street, said walks to be six feet in width of Brick or Plank, if made of lumber, oak or Pine plank must be used 1 1/2 inches thick laid crosswise on three string 4x4 inches, and permanently spiked together.

The Recorder was ordered to W. Hester to make a side walk in front of his new house on West or Mechanic Street, and also to repair and raise the walk in front of his building on the north side of Alliance Street, now occupied as a Boot & Shoe store.
