

Alliance April 12th 1869

Council Elect Met at the Call of Mayor J. Ewan, who took the Chair, the following Members appeared and were duly sworn as required as required by law J. C. Sutton, Henry Altman, J. Armstrong, Caleb Steel and John Hunter, Councilmen, W. H. Lee Treasurer, E. C. Brown Marshal and Joseph Barnaby Recorder,

W. H. Lee, presented his Bond in the sum of \$900.00 signed by Samuel Shaffer and H. Altman, ^{as sureties}, which on Motion was approved,

E. C. Brown, presented his Bond in the sum of \$500.00 signed by H. S. Pettit and Samuel Clapsdale as sureties, which on Motion was approved

The Bond of J. D. Parker, Mayor Elect, was present in the sum of \$1000.00 signed by J. C. Sutton and Caleb Steel as sureties which on Motion was approved,

On Motion Adjourned to Meet on Monday Evening the 19th inst at 7 o'clock P.M.

Council Met pursuant to adjournment, Mayor J. D. Parker in the Chair, Members all present except the Recorder, J. Armstrong was appointed Recorder Pro Tem in the absence of J. Barnaby,

On Motion the Recorder was instructed to make a full statement of the financial condition of the Incorporation; also the condition of all Contracts in reference to side walks or other improvements of the Village.

Committees On Motion, ^{the following} Caleb Steel and H. Altman, were appointed on Finance,

Caleb Steel and J. Armstrong Committee on side walks

J. C. Sutton and John Hunter, Committee on streets and alleys, with instructions to ascertain the cost of grading, paving streets, and constructing sewers and ditches, to have a general supervision in regard to the improvement

and alley.

On Motion

The Council then proceeded to ballot for Street Commissioners for the ensuing year, which resulted as follows, J. B. Johnson received five votes and P. B. Garland one vote, thereupon J. B. Johnson was declared duly elected; and E. C. Brown, being present was instructed to notify said J. B. Johnson, of his election, and also to prepare a Bond with sureties in the sum of \$500 and present to the Council at their next Meeting, for approval or rejection.

A. Petition

J. B. Johnson presented a petition, praying that an ordinance be enacted requiring Steamboats within the Incorporation, to pay a licence for their business, which on Motion was received a refusal to O. D. Parker as to its legality.

W. Petition

Was presented signed by O. Hickman and others praying that a side walk be opened on the East side of Mahoning Street from Rail Road Street to Green Street, which was received and referred to Committee on side walks.

Elisha Teters presented a Bill for Rent for lot on which the Village prison is located, for eight years at \$500 per year \$4000 which on Motion was referred to Committee on Finance.

On Motion An order was drawn on the Treasurer in favor of M. H. Seel to apply on fees as Treasurer.

On Motion The Mayor was instructed to complete the Contract with Gillespie and Webb, for Rooms for Mayors Office and Council Chamber, at \$1200 per year, and that he have the privilege to sub let to Ray & Shalters, & Anthony or other parties so as not to interfere with the business of the Room for the business of the Mayor or Council, at such rate of Rent as he may deem right.

On Motion A Resolution was unanimously passed giving the Committee on Streets and Alleys Control in the Matter of persons depositing Earth from Cellars, or elsewhere upon the Streets or alley in the Village, and to prohibit all such deposits except where the Grade may require such Streets or alley to be raised.

On Motion The following persons were appointed as a Board of Health for the ensuing year, Dr J. B. Nelson, Dr J. C. Heaton and Isaac Ewan;
